Match background

SSC Napoli ended Manchester City FC's hopes in the UEFA Champions League group stage and will be looking to do the same to another English team when they welcome Chelsea FC in the first leg of their round of 16 encounter.

• In the first ever fixture between the sides, the Italian team will be keen to continue their fine European home run. Since returning to continental competition after 13 years in 2008, Napoli have gone 11 matches unbeaten. The last foreign outfit to prevail in Naples were Eintracht Frankfurt in December 1994.

Match background

- This is only Napoli's third home assignment against English opponents although all have come in the space of 17 months. Their first was a goalless draw with Liverpool FC in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League group stage.
- The meeting with Manchester City at the Stadio San Paolo on 22 November proved pivotal to their qualification hopes this season. Edinson Cavani's two goals steered the Partenopei to a 2-1 victory and an eventual one-point advantage over the Roberto Mancini's side at the conclusion of Group A.
- Napoli registered another home win in the section, beating Villarreal CF 2-0, while between those victories came a 1-1 draw with FC Bayern München. Toni Kroos's early goal for Bayern on matchday three ended Napoli's impressive run of 573 minutes without conceding at home in Europe.
- Chelsea, who are competing in the last 16 for the ninth season in succession, have won only once in seven visits to Italy, a 4-0 group stage success at S.S. Lazio in 2003/04. The other six games have resulted in three defeats and three draws.
- Their last visit was a 2-1 defeat by FC Internazionale Milano at this stage two years ago. The Italian side, under former Chelsea manager José Mourinho, won 3-1 on aggregate as they built a momentum which propelled them to their third European Champion Clubs' Cup title.
- In knockout contests against Serie A sides, however, Chelsea have two triumphs from three attempts. They knocked out Juventus 3-2 on aggregate at this stage in 2008/09 and beat Vicenza Calcio by the same overall score in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup semi-finals en route to lifting that trophy for the second time.
- Last season the London side won 2-0 at FC København in the round of 16 first leg, also the aggregate score. They bowed out of the competition in the quarter-finals after Manchester United FC beat them 1-0 away and 2-1 at Old Trafford.
- Chelsea won their group for the fifth time in six seasons without recording a victory on their travels. They drew at Valencia CF and KRC Genk and lost at Bayer 04 Leverkusen.

Team ties

- Between 2008 and 2009, André Villas-Boas worked as an assistant to Mourinho at Inter.
- Andrea Dossena and Fernando Torres were team-mates at Liverpool FC between 2008 and 2010.
- Salomon Kalou scored Chelsea's goal in the 2-1 defeat at Goran Pandev's Inter in the first leg of that 2009/10 UEFA Champions League round of 16 tie.
- Frank Lampard scored from the penalty spot at Wembley as England drew 2-2 against a Switzerland side which included Gökhan Inler and Blerim Dzemaili in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier on 4 June 2011. John Terry and Ashley Cole also appeared for the home side.
- Marek Hamšík scored a 73rd-minute penalty past Petr Čech as Slovakia earned a 2-2 home draw against the Czech Republic in a FIFA World Cup qualifier in September 2009.
- Inler captained the Swiss side which beat Spain 1-0 in their opening 2010 World Cup group stage game in Durban. Torres appeared as a second-half substitute while Juan Mata remained on the bench.
- Inler's Switzerland beat Portugal 2-0 at UEFA EURO 2008 in Basel. Paulo Ferreira and Raul Meireles were in the opposition lineup while José Bosingwa was on the bench.
- In the opening game of that tournament Inler faced Čech as the goalkeeper's Czech Republic side beat the co-hosts 1-0 in Basel.

- Napoli secured only their third win in nine games in all competitions, but their second in five days.
- Edinson Cavani has registered 16 goals in his last 18 outings.
- · Goalkeeper Antonio Rosati made his league debut for Napoli after Morgan De Sanctis was ruled out.
- The Partenopei have drawn ten Serie A games already this term, including seven in their last 14 league outings; they drew seven times all last season en route to a third-place finish.
- Napoli are six games unbeaten at home, winning four, since a 3-1 defeat by AS Roma on 18 December.
- Miguel Britos scored his first goal for Napoli in a 2-0 win against AC Chievo Verona on 13 February.
- Napoli beat AC Cesena (2-1) and FC Internazionale Milano (2-0) to reach the Coppa Italia semi-finals, where they lost the first leg 2-1 at AC Siena on 9 February. The return takes place on 21 March.
- Napoli defeated Genoa CFC 6-1 on 21 December, scoring six goals in a Serie A game for the first time since 16 December 2000, when they beat Reggina Calcio 6-2.
- Marek Hamšík has converted just five of his last ten penalties for the club.

Injury news

- Hugo Campagnaro was forced off with a right calf injury 12 minutes into Friday's game at Fiorentina.
- De Sanctis was denied a 100th successive Serie A start on Friday because of a minor knock picked up in training.
- Eduardo Vargas missed the Fiorentina game having twisted his right ankle after coming on as an 89th-minute substitute against Chievo on 13 February.
- Marco Donadel, out since injuring his right thigh in training on 3 September, made his first appearance of the season on 12 January in a 2-1 Coppa Italia win against Cesena.

- Chelsea have committed 61 fouls, the lowest total of the last-16 teams ahead of the first legs along with FC Barcelona.
- David Luiz and Raul Meireles will incur a suspension with their next yellow cards.

- Daniel Sturridge scored his seventh goal in six FA Cup starts for Chelsea to earn a fifth-round replay against second-tier Birmingham. The draw leaves the west London side four games without a win in all competitions.
- Juan Mata had a 23rd-minute penalty saved, the fourth spot kick in eight attempts this season that Chelsea have failed to convert.
- Chelsea, who have lifted the cup in three of the last six seasons, have lost only two of their last 30 FA Cup matches one of those was on spot kicks.
- Chelsea have not won in four Premier League games; since beating Sunderland AFC 1-0 on 14 January they have drawn three and lost 2-0 at Everton FC in their most recent fixture on 11 February.
- Eleven of the 31 league goals Chelsea have conceded this season have come in the last 15 minutes.
- Defeats by Arsenal FC (5-3, 29 October) and Liverpool FC (2-1, 20 November) were Chelsea's first consecutive Premier League losses at Stamford Bridge since Roman Abramovich bought the club in 2003.
- Chelsea have won only four of their last 13 matches in all competitions, losing two.
- Didier Drogba scored his 150th Chelsea goal against Aston Villa FC on 31 December, taking him joint fourth on the club's all-time list.

- Ramires (knee ligament, out since 28 January) and John Obi Mikel (hamstring, 22 December) returned to action as starters against Birmingham.
- Ashley Cole (calf, out since 11 February) and John Terry (knee, 28 January) missed Saturday's game.
- Michael Essien returned to action on 14 January after suffering knee ligament damage in pre-season training.

- A product of Fiorentina's youth system, Mazzarri spent the large part of his playing career in Italy's lower divisions, the highlight arguably coming when he helped Empoli earn their first ever promotion to Serie A in 1985/86.
- Began his career in the dugout as assistant to his former coach Renzo Ulivieri at Bologna in 1996; he later followed Uliveri to Napoli in the same capacity before assuming first-team duties at fourth-division Acireale in 2001.
- Appointed by Livorno in 2003/04 and immediately steered the Serie B outfit to promotion, before leaving for Reggina that summer. Awarded honorary citizenship by the municipality of Reggio Calabria after saving the southern side from relegation despite an 11-point deduction in 2006/07.
- Joined Sampdoria in 2007 and led the Blucerchiati to sixth place in his first season. He followed that up by taking the club to the Coppa Italia final in 2008/09, where they lost to S.S. Lazio on penalties.
- Opted not to renew his Sampdoria contract at the end of that campaign and was recruited by Napoli in October 2009 following the dismissal of Roberto Donadoni. He guided the Partenopei to sixth place in Serie A in his first season and third a year later.

- An amateur player in his teens with Ramaldense FC and Clube Marechal Gomes da Costa, Villas-Boas never played professional football, laying the groundwork for a coaching career with a spell as a teenage talent scout during Sir Bobby Robson's spell as coach of Porto in the mid-1990s.
- Still in his 20s, he took on a role as technical director with the British Virgin Islands Football Association in 2000, but was back working with Porto's youth players by the time José Mourinho took him into his inner circle following his appointment as Porto coach in January 2002.
- Initially detailed to scout upcoming opponents, he followed 'The Special One' from success to success at Porto, Chelsea and FC Internazionale Milano before striking out on his own as coach of Académica in October 2009.
- An 11th-placed finish in his only season in Coimbra was enough to persuade Porto to bring him in as Jesualdo Ferreira's replacement; hired in June 2010, he became the club's youngest ever coach aged just 32.
- Oversaw a memorable 2010/11 campaign at the Estádio do Dragão, becoming the first Portuguese to guide a side through a Liga campaign unbeaten, winning the Super Cup, national championship and Portuguese Cup as well as the UEFA Europa League after beating SC Braga in the Dublin final. He joined Chelsea on a three-year deal on 22 June 2011.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 24 occasions although only twice AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty ties have been decided on the away goals rule, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 first knockout round, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any previous UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Ten ties have gone to penalties, including the game between Arsenal FC and AS Roma in the 2008/09 round of 16. Five of these were finals 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot-kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- In all, 17 ties have required extra time. So far seven have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, two first knockout round encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United FC lost the 2011 final in London. Five teams won Champion Clubs' Cup finals on home soil: Real Madrid CF (1957), FC Internazionale Milano (1965), Manchester United FC (1968), AFC Ajax (1972) and Liverpool FC (1978), while Stade de Reims Champagne (1956), AS Roma (1984) and FC Barcelona (1986) all lost finals in their own country.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6 of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 148 days, in Manchester United's 2-0 win at FC Schalke 04 on 26 April 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
