Match background

A first defeat of the campaign has put Chelsea FC in jeopardy of missing out on the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds for the first time since 2002/03 as Valencia CF visit Stamford Bridge.

• An away win or a scoring draw would be enough to take the visitors through. Chelsea are in this position having lost the lead at Bayer 04 Leverkusen on matchday five, ultimately succumbing 2-1; the same night, Valencia put seven goals without reply past KRC Genk, Roberto Soldado scoring a 26-minute hat-trick, to join Chelsea on eight points, one behind Leverkusen.

• It was a late Soldado penalty that earned Valencia a 1-1 draw on matchday two in the teams' fifth fixture since April 2007. Frank Lampard had put Chelsea in front.

• The game came after Chelsea's opening-day win against Leverkusen, while the two matches with Genk yielded a 5-0 home victory and another 1-1 away draw.

• Valencia began with a goalless draw at Genk and, having drawn at Chelsea, lost 2-1 to Leverkusen before reviving their campaign with a 3-1 win at home to the Bundesliga club.

Previous meetings

• Both the previous meetings between the teams at Stamford Bridge ended level, 1-1 in the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League quarter-final and 0-0 in the following season's group stage. With Chelsea winning both away games 2-1, the London club are unbeaten in the five matches between the sides.

• The lineups in the most recent meeting at Stamford Bridge on 11 December 2007 were:

• Chelsea are undefeated against Spanish opponents, home and away, in 12 competitive fixtures since a 2-1 reverse at Stamford Bridge against FC Barcelona in the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League round of 16. That was their one and only setback against Spanish opponents on home soil; their record is W7 D4 L1.

• Two significant victories against Spanish opponents came on neutral soil. Chelsea played Real Madrid CF in the 1970/71 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup final in Athens, prevailing in the replay 2-1 after a 1-1 draw. The teams also met in the 1998 UEFA Super Cup in Monaco, Chelsea winning 1-0.

• Valencia have drawn on each of their last four visits to England, the last 12 months ago when Pablo Hernández put the visitors ahead in a group stage fixture at Manchester United FC which ended 1-1.

• In a total of 14 visits to England for European ties they have drawn no less than nine, with one victory – 1-0 at Liverpool FC in the 2002/03 UEFA Champions League first group stage – and four defeats.

• Valencia owed their first two European trophies – the 1979/80 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and the UEFA Super Cup the following season – to victories against English opposition. They overcame Arsenal FC in the first instance following a penalty shoot-out, and then triumphed on away goals against Nottingham Forest FC.

Team ties

• Nurtured at Madrid's youth academy, Mata joined Valencia in 2007, scoring 45 times in 172 appearances before moving to Chelsea in August. The FIFA World Cup winner with Spain made his UEFA Champions League debut in Valencia's goalless draw against Chelsea at Stamford Bridge on 11 December 2007.

• Fernando Torres scored two goals in eight encounters against Valencia while at Club Atlético de Madrid and was sent off in the Rojiblancos' 1-0 home Liga defeat on 9 September 2006.

• Ramires and Jonas – making his international debut – appeared as Brazil secured a 2-0 friendly victory against Scotland on 27 March 2011.

• Adil Rami and Florent Malouda are international team-mates for France while Nicolas Anelka and Jérémy Mathieu have also represented Les Bleus.

• Anelka scored twice in 19 Liga appearances for Madrid in 1999/2000.

• Daniel Parejo made 18 appearances for Queens Park Rangers FC while on loan from Madrid between August and December 2008.

• Chelsea recorded their second successive 3-0 league victory; only their second win in five games in all competitions. Frank Lampard had an early penalty saved and Daniel Sturridge struck the post; Newcastle hit the woodwork three times.

• André Villas-Boas' side completed back-to-back clean sheets in the league, as many as they managed in 12 previous top-flight outings this season.

• Sturridge's six league goals this season have come at an average of one every 105 minutes.

• The Blues had lost three of their previous four Premier League games before a 3-0 win against Wolverhampton Wanderers FC on 26 November, a match which marked Oriol Romeu's first top-flight start for Chelsea.

• Defeats by Arsenal FC (5-3, 29 October) and Liverpool FC (2-0, 20 November) were Chelsea's first consecutive Premier League losses at Stamford Bridge since Roman Abramovich bought the club in 2003.

• Chelsea were also beaten 2-0 at home by Liverpool in the League Cup quarter-finals on 29 November; they have lost five of their last ten matches in all competitions, winning four.

• Lampard was Chelsea captain for the 50th time in the cup defeat by Liverpool, which was José Bosingwa's 100th appearance for the club.

• Chelsea will play Portsmouth FC in the FA Cup third round on 7/8 January.

Injury news

• Michael Essien could be out of action until January after suffering knee ligament damage in pre-season training.

Miscellaneous

• Sturridge made his senior international debut in England's 1-0 home friendly win against Sweden on 15 November.

• Drogba, who took the prize in 2006 and 2009, is one of ten players nominated for CAF African Footballer of the Year award. The winner will be announced in Accra on 22 December.

• Five Chelsea players have been nominated for the FIFA FIFPro World XI, which will be announced at the FIFA Ballon d'Or ceremony in Zurich on 9 January: Cole, David Luiz, John Terry, Lampard and Drogba.

• Jim Lewis, a member of Chelsea's title-winning side in 1954/55, died on 21 November aged 84. He scored 40 goals in 95 Chelsea appearances.

- Tino Costa's third goal in as many games set Valencia on course for their seventh win in eight matches.
- Roberto Soldado has registered 26 goals in his last 28 outings, and six in his last four.

• Jonas opened the scoring for the second game running as Valencia triumphed 2-1 at Rayo Vallecano de Madrid on 26 November, their third successive away win.

• Valencia will play third-tier side Cádiz CF in the Copa del Rey round of 32 on 13 and 21 December.

Injury news

- Víctor Ruíz has not played since being replaced at half-time on matchday five with a right adductor strain.
- Ricardo Costa is continuing his recovery from the torn left hamstring he sustained in training on 11 November.
- Banega has been ruled out of the remainder of the group stage after straining knee ligaments on matchday four.
- Sergio Canales is expected to be sidelined until April after partially tearing a right knee ligament on 23 October.

• Hedwiges Maduro is likely to be out of action until February after tearing ankle ligaments while training with the Netherlands at the start of October.

- Jérémy Mathieu made his international debut on 11 November as France beat the United States 1-0.
- Jonas scored both goals his first at international level as Brazil defeated Egypt 2-0 in Doha on 14 November.

• An amateur player in his teens with Ramaldense FC and Clube Marechal Gomes da Costa, Villas-Boas never played professional football, laying the groundwork for a coaching career with a spell as a teenage talent scout during Sir Bobby Robson's spell as coach of Porto in the mid-1990s.

• Still in his 20s, he took on a role as technical director with the British Virgin Islands Football Association in 2000, but was back working with Porto's youth players by the time José Mourinho took him into his inner circle following his appointment as Porto coach in January 2002.

• Initially detailed to scout upcoming opponents, he followed 'The Special One' from success to success at Porto, Chelsea and FC Internazionale Milano before striking out on his own as coach of Académica in October 2009.

• An 11th-placed finish in his only season in Coimbra was enough to persuade Porto to bring him in as Jesualdo Ferreira's replacement; hired in June 2010, he became the club's youngest ever coach aged just 32.

• Oversaw a memorable 2010/11 campaign at the Estádio do Dragão, becoming the first Portuguese to guide a side through a Liga campaign unbeaten, winning the Super Cup, national championship and Portuguese Cup as well as the UEFA Europa League after beating SC Braga in the Dublin final. He joined Chelsea on a three-year deal on 22 June 2011.

• The son and grandson of famous goalkeepers, Unai Emery took his first steps as a footballer in the youth ranks at Real Sociedad, where he played as a left-sided midfielder.

• Failing to shine with the first team at Real, Emery went on to carve out a career in the lower leagues with Toledo, Ferrol, Leganés and Lorca but was eventually forced to retire at 33 having suffered a knee injury.

• He was immediately offered the chance to coach Lorca – the club with whom he had ended his playing career – and took them up to the second division in his first season in charge, 2004/05.

• After coming close to taking Lorca into the Spanish top flight the following season, was appointed by UD Almería ahead of the 2006/07 campaign and duly won promotion to the Liga.

• Almería shone among the Spanish elite, finishing the season in eighth place while their manager's reputation soared, earning him a call to replace Ronald Koeman at Valencia, whom he guided to third place in the Liga in both 2009/10 and 2010/11.

• Italian referee Gianluca Rocchi has enjoyed a steady rise through the ranks, being promoted to UEFA's Premier category in July 2009 before moving up to Elite status in May of the following year.

• Born in Florence on 25 August 1973, Rocchi began his refereeing career in Serie C back in 2000, spending the next three seasons learning his trade in the third tier of Italian football.

• Stepped up to Serie B in 2003, subsequently also taking charge of top-flight games, Rocchi was given regular assignments in UEFA competition as a fourth official from 2004/05 onwards, featuring in the group stages of both the UEFA Champions League and UEFA Cup.

• Handed his first UEFA Cup refereeing assignment at the start of 2008/09, Rocchi took charge of four matches in total in the competition proper that season and was in the middle for six more in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League. He finished the season by working as fourth official as Club Atlético de Madrid beat Fulham FC in the final in Hamburg.

• Often entrusted with some of Serie A's biggest matches, Rocchi made his UEFA Champions League refereeing debut in August 2009 when SK Slavia Praha took on FC Sheriff in the third qualifying round and featured in the group stage for the first time in September 2010 when FC Schalke 04 defeated SL Benfica.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Group stage milestones

• Holders FC Barcelona have avoided becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

• In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

• No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.

• S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos FC on matchday one at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07 at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six.

• Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.

• Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

• Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.

• Barcelona and Manchester United FC have both finished as group winners on 12 occasions, one more than Real Madrid.

• Four teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96) and Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage).

• Twelve teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including MŠK Žilina and FK Partizan in 2010/11. The other ten are: Maccabi Haifa FC and Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), PFC Levski Sofia (2006/07), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06), Anderlecht (2004/05), Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively), Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage) and 1. FC Košice (1997/98).

• Manchester United scored 20 goals in the 1998/99 group stage, more than any other side has managed. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage.

• MŠK Žilina conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2010/11, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Debrecen (2009/10), Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC in 1995/96.

• No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea FC (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal CF (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.

• Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on matchday three of the same campaign.

• The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before FC Dynamo Kyiv and Bayer 04 Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
