Match background

Chelsea FC begin the defence of the UEFA Champions League trophy they won so dramatically in May with a home game against Juventus.

Previous meetings

• The teams met in the 2008/09 round of 16 when a 12th-minute Didier Drogba goal gave Chelsea a 1-0 first-leg victory in London before a 2-2 draw in Turin.

• The lineups at Stamford Bridge on 25 February 2009 were:

• Chelsea overcame Italian opponents in the 2011/12 round of 16, beating SSC Napoli 4-1 at home after a 3-1 away defeat. They have won five and drawn one of their eight home games against Serie A clubs, losing 1-0 against FC Internazionale Milano in the 2009/10 round of 16 and 2-1 against S.S. Lazio in the 1999/2000 second group stage.

• Juventus have not won on their last 11 competitive outings in England, losing eight and drawing three, including their 2003 UEFA Champions League final penalty shoot-out defeat by AC Milan.

• Juve have triumphed just twice in 19 contests away to English opposition: 2-1 against Aston Villa FC in the 1982/83 European Champion Clubs' Cup quarter-finals and 1-0 at Manchester United FC in the 1996/97 group stage.

Match background

• Last season Chelsea finally tasted UEFA Champions League glory at the tenth attempt, overcoming FC Bayern München on the German side's own ground. Drogba scored a late equaliser to take the final to extra time and then converted the decisive penalty to win the shoot-out 4-3, the Ivorian striker's last kick for the club as he joined Chinese side FC Shanghai Shenhua in June.

• Chelsea have finished as group winners in seven of their last nine campaigns, qualifying for the knockout rounds as runners-up in the other two years.

• Last season's 2-0 home win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen was the Blues' eighth success in ten matchday one fixtures (the other two were draws). They won all three home games in their 2011/12 group, scoring ten goals without conceding, and recorded three more home victories in the knockout stages.

• Juventus, winners of the Scudetto in 2011/12 and unbeaten in the 38-game season, were last in the UEFA Champions League in 2009/10 when they began with a 1-1 home draw against FC Girondins de Bordeaux.

Team ties

• Chelsea manager Roberto Di Matteo made 34 appearances for Italy and played in Serie A for Lazio between 1993 and 1996. He scored the opening goal as Lazio beat Juventus 3-0 in Turin on 7 May 1995.

• Di Matteo was playing for Italy when Gianluigi Buffon made his international debut in a 1-1 draw against Russia in Moscow in the first leg of the 1998 FIFA World Cup qualifying play-offs.

• Fernando Torres and Juan Mata scored past Buffon in Spain's 4-0 win against Italy in the UEFA EURO 2012 final. Andrea Pirlo, Andrea Barzagli, Leonardo Bonucci, Giorgio Chiellini and Claudio Marchisio also played for the Azzurri.

• Pirlo scored in a shoot-out against England in the quarter-finals of UEFA EURO 2012 as the Azzurri won 4-2 on penalties, Buffon saving England's fourth kick from Ashley Cole. Barzagli, Bonucci and Marchisio also played for Italy while John Terry was in the England lineup.

• Pirlo scored a penalty against Petr Čech in the semi-finals of the 2002 UEFA European Under-21 Championships but Italy went down 3-2 in extra time against the Czech Republic.

• Paul Pogba made three Premier League appearances for Manchester United in 2011/12.

• Nicklas Bendtner had spent his entire career in England before joining Juventus on Ioan from Arsenal FC in the summer. He had Ioan spells at Birmingham City FC and Sunderland AFC and was on the winning side twice in seven appearances against Chelsea. On 10 May 2009 he scored Arsenal's goal in a 4-1 home league defeat by Chelsea.

· David Luiz and Ramires have played for Brazil alongside Lúcio.

• Stephan Lichtsteiner and Eden Hazard played together at LOSC Lille in 2007/08.

Chelsea have conceded 97 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.

• The Blues won all six of their UEFA Champions League home games last season, scoring 17 goals and conceding two in the process.

• John Terry is available after serving a two-match suspension following his red card in last season's semi-final second leg at FC Barcelona.

International duty

• Fourteen Chelsea players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Terry, Frank Lampard, Gary Cahill, Daniel Sturridge, Ashley Cole, Ryan Bertrand (England), Eden Hazard (Belgium), Fernando Torres, Juan Mata (Spain), Petr Čech (Czech Republic), Branislav Ivanović (Serbia), David Luiz, Ramires and Oscar (Brazil).

• Lampard scored twice, the first a penalty, as England kicked off 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifying with a 5-0 victory in Moldova on 7 September. He was on target from the spot again four days later in a 1-1 draw with Ukraine; Bertrand came on for his competitive debut for England.

• Cole missed both of England's games with an ankle knock, while a similar problem ruled Terry out of the Ukraine match.

• Captain Ivanović scored his seventh goal in 54 international appearances in Serbia's 6-1 qualifying victory over Wales on 11 September.

• Fernando Torres won his 100th cap for Spain on 7 September in a 5-0 friendly win against Saudi Arabia.

• Ramires and Oscar (penalty) were on target as Brazil triumphed 8-0 over China in a friendly on 10 September.

• Oriol Romeu helped Spain advance to the UEFA European Under-21 Championship play-offs as group winners.

• Mata and Torres came off the bench to score in Spain's UEFA EURO 2012 final victory against Italy on 1 July, the latter becoming the first player to find the net in two UEFA European Championship showpieces.

• Chelsea's 4-1 defeat by Atlético on 31 August equalled the record for the heaviest UEFA Super Cup loss by reigning European champions. FC Bayern München suffered an identical reverse at RSC Anderlecht in 1976.

• Bertrand, who made his senior international debut in England's friendly against Italy last month, signed a new five-year deal on 5 September.

• FA Cup holders Chelsea lost 3-2 to Premier League champions Manchester City FC in the FA Community Shield on 12 August.

• The Juventus Stadium, opened in 2011, will host UEFA Champions League games for the first time this season. Their record in 20 home matches over the previous five European campaigns reads: W14 D4 L2.

• Juventus' next draw will be their 50th in the European Cup.

International duty

• Twelve Juventus players were on senior duty during the international break: Gianluigi Buffon, Andrea Barzagli, Leonardo Bonucci, Emanuele Giaccherini, Claudio Marchisio, Andrea Pirlo, Sebastian Giovinco (Italy), Kwadwo Asamoah (Ghana), Mauricio Isla, Arturo Vidal (Chile), Stephen Lichtsteiner (Switzerland) and Mirko Vučinić (Montenegro).

• All seven Juve players started Italy's 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifying 2-2 draw with Bulgaria on 7 September. Giaccherini and Giovinco dropped out of the XI four days later, when Marchisio and Pirlo claimed an assist apiece in a 2-0 win against Malta.

- Pirlo won his 91st cap against Malta, joining Alessandro Del Piero in seventh on Italy's list of all-time appearances.
- Vučinić scored as Montenegro drew 2-2 with Poland in qualifying on 7 September.

• Buffon, Bonucci, Barzagli, Giorgio Chiellini, Pirlo and Marchisio played the UEFA EURO 2012 final in July, losing 4-0 to Spain.

• Isla made his first competitive appearance in seven months following a knee injury when he started Chile's 3-1 defeat by Colombia on 11 September.

• Pedro Proença has been on the rise in European refereeing circles since taking charge of the UEFA European Under-19 Championship final in 2004. He achieved UEFA Premier referee status in January 2007 but had been a fixture on the international scene for some time, enjoying regular outings in UEFA's two high-profile club competitions since making his UEFA Champions League group stage debut on matchday one of the 2007/08 campaign.

• A financial director from Pinhal Novo, Proença enjoys skiing in his spare time along with a love of reading and writing.

• Notable matches include the 2007 and 2010 Portuguese Cup finals, and he also ran the rule over two FC Porto successes in the domestic Super Cup in August 2003 and 2006.

• Proença took charge of two UEFA EURO 2008 qualifiers and was at the 2009 European U21 Championship, overseeing three games as a referee and acting as fourth official in Germany's 4-0 final defeat of England.

• Promoted to UEFA's Elite category at the start of 2009/10, he oversaw four games in that season's UEFA Champions League group stage and five in the 2010/11 competition. The next season brought six more UEFA Champions League engagements, ending with the final between FC Bayern München and Chelsea FC in Munich, and there was another high point to come at UEFA EURO 2012, where he oversaw four matches culminating in the Spain-Italy final.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

• Holders Chelsea FC are hoping to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

• No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.

• S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.

• Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.

• Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.

• Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.

• Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight last season.

• Barcelona have finished as group winners on 13 occasions, one more than Manchester United and Real Madrid.

• Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).

• Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.

• Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.

• Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record. The previous highest goals against total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC in 1995/96.

• No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.

• Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.

• The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv and Bayer 04 Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.

• Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
