## Match background

---

The first game between Juventus and Chelsea FC was an exciting affair in which the Italian visitors fought back from two goals down. Now both teams need points to underpin their Group E ambitions.

- On matchday one Oscar scored twice on his first start as Chelsea made a strong opening to their UEFA Champions League defence, but Arturo Vidal reduced the arrears before Fabio Quagliarella scored Juve's late equaliser.
- The Serie A champions also came from behind in their next two games to earn 1-1 draws, at home to FC Shakhtar Donetsk in their first European game at the new Juventus Stadium and then at FC Nordsjælland. That made it nine successive European draws, a record run ended in the home game against the Danish side, a 4-0 win moving Juve on to six points.
- Chelsea had won by the same 4-0 scoreline in Copenhagen but went down 2-1 at Shakhtar and then needed a late Victor Moses goal to see off the Ukrainian champions 3-2 at Stamford Bridge. That left Chelsea level on seven points with Shakhtar but behind on head-to-head record, and one point ahead of Juve.

### Previous meetings

- The teams' first fixtures came in the 2008/09 round of 16 when Chelsea followed a 1-0 first-leg home win with a 2-2 draw in Turin in which Giorgio Chiellini was sent off on 70 minutes.
- The lineups at Stadio Olimpico on 10 March 2009 were:  
**Juventus:** Buffon, Chiellini, Mellberg, Nedvěd (Salihamidžić 13), Marchisio, Grygera, Molinaro, Tiago, Iaquinta (Giovenco 61), Del Piero, Trezeguet (Amauri 79).  
**Chelsea:** Čech, Bosingwa, Terry, Alex (Carvalho 89), A Cole, Essien (Belletti 66), Lampard, Mikel, Ballack, Anelka, Drogba.
- Chelsea overcame Italian opponents on their way to lifting the trophy for the first time in May. In the round of 16 they lost 3-1 away to SSC Napoli but, with Roberto Di Matteo having taken over as manager, won 4-1 in the return.
- The Blues have won only once in eight visits to Italy, a 4-0 group stage success at S.S. Lazio in 2003/04 in which Frank Lampard got the final goal. The other seven games have resulted in four defeats and three draws.
- This is Juventus' 42nd meeting with English sides; their record is W15 D11 L15. At home they have won 12 of the 20 meetings, including a 2-0 victory over Liverpool FC in the home leg of the 1985 UEFA Super Cup – but only one of the last six – with five drawn. The most recent Turin defeat came in the 2002/03 second group stage, Manchester United FC winning 3-0.

### Match background

- Chelsea have now lost three of their last 12 away group games, winning five.

### Team ties

- Di Matteo made 34 appearances for Italy and played in Serie A for Lazio between 1993 and 1996. He scored the opening goal as Lazio beat Juventus 3-0 in Turin on 7 May 1995.
- Di Matteo was playing for Italy when Gianluigi Buffon made his international debut in a 1-1 draw against Russia in Moscow in the first leg of 1998 FIFA World Cup qualifying play-offs.
- Fernando Torres and Juan Mata scored past Buffon in Spain's 4-0 win against Italy in the UEFA EURO 2012 final in Kyiv. Andrea Pirlo, Andrea Barzagli, Leonardo Bonucci, Chiellini and Claudio Marchisio also played for the Azzurri with Sebastian Giovinco an unused substitute.
- Pirlo scored in a shoot-out against England in the quarter-finals of UEFA EURO 2012 as the Azzurri won 4-2 on penalties, Buffon saving England's fourth kick from Ashley Cole. Barzagli, Bonucci and Marchisio also played for Italy while John Terry was in the England lineup and Giovinco again on the bench.
- Paul Pogba made three Premier League appearances for Manchester United in 2011/12.
- Nicklas Bendtner had spent his entire professional career in England before joining Juventus on loan from Arsenal FC in the summer. He also had loan spells at Birmingham City FC and Sunderland AFC and was on the winning side twice in seven appearances against Chelsea. On 10 May 2009 he scored Arsenal's goal in a 4-1 home league defeat.
- David Luiz and Ramires have played for Brazil alongside Lúcio.
- Stephan Lichtsteiner and Eden Hazard played together at LOSC Lille in 2007/08.

## Match facts

---

### Juventus

#### UEFA Champions League statistics

- Juventus's win against FC Nordsjælland on matchday four ended an unprecedented nine successive draws in European competition; the previous high was seven.
- Claudio Marchisio and Sebastian Giovinco scored their first UEFA Champions League goals on matchday four.
- On matchday one Juventus became only the second team to avoid defeat against Chelsea in the UEFA Champions League after going two goals down, following AS Monaco FC in the 2004 semi-final second leg.
- The Turin team have scored 197 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.
- Juve have had more shots wide (40) than any other team in the group stage.
- Gianluigi Buffon, Leonardo Bonucci, Marchisio and Andrea Pirlo have played every minute of Juve's group stage campaign.
- Giorgio Chiellini and Marchisio's next yellow cards will incur a suspension.

#### International duty

- Twelve Juventus players were on senior duty during the international break: Buffon, Andrea Barzagli, Bonucci, Chiellini, Emanuele Giaccherini, Marchisio, Pirlo, Giovinco (Italy), Arturo Vidal (Chile), Stephan Lichtsteiner (Switzerland), Martín Cáceres (Uruguay) and Nicklas Bendtner (Denmark).
- Chiellini captained Italy for the first time last Wednesday in a 2-1 defeat by France. Barzagli, Bonucci, Giaccherini, Marchisio, Pirlo and Giovinco also featured in Parma. Bendtner skippered Denmark for the first time the same night, scoring a penalty in a 1-1 draw in Turkey.
- Vidal was sent off in Chile's 3-1 defeat by Serbia last Wednesday. He was also dismissed on his previous international appearance, a 3-1 loss in Ecuador.
- Luca Marrone (Italy Under-21s) and Paul Pogba (France Under-20s) were also on international duty.

#### Miscellaneous

- Juve were held to a 0-0 draw by S.S. Lazio on Saturday, the first time in 18 home games in all competition that the Bianconeri have failed to score. Simone Pepe made his first appearance since May after a thigh problem; Mirko Vučinić missed out with flu.
- On 10 November Fabio Quagliarella scored his first professional hat-trick as Juventus won 6-1 at Pescara, their largest away victory in Serie A since beating AC Milan by the same scoreline on 6 April 1997.
- The Bianconeri's 49-game unbeaten run in Serie A, since a 1-0 defeat at Parma FC on 15 May 2011, ended on 3 November with a 3-1 loss at home to FC Internazionale Milano. Juve fell short of the Italian top-flight record of 58 games without defeat, set by AC Milan between 1991 and 1993.
- Buffon and Pirlo are nominees for the FIFA Ballon d'Or award, the winner of which will be announced on 7 January.
- Juve are 28 games unbeaten away from home in all competitions, since the 1-0 defeat at Parma on 15 May 2011.

### Chelsea

#### UEFA Champions League statistics

- Chelsea have scored 197 goals in the European Cup and conceded 145 in UEFA competition.
- The Blues have won just two of their last nine away games in the competition, losing four and drawing three.
- Chelsea's 4-0 victory at FC Nordsjælland on matchday two was the fifth time the Blues have scored four or more goals in an away UEFA Champions League game.
- Before matchday one, Chelsea had only once previously let slip a two-goal lead in the UEFA Champions League, against AS Monaco FC in the 2004 semi-finals.
- Victor Moses scored his first UEFA Champions League goal on matchday four, four days after his first Premier League goal for Chelsea in a 1-1 draw at Swansea City AFC.
- Petr Čech, Branislav Ivanović and David Luiz have played every minute of Chelsea's group stage campaign.

- Luiz's next yellow card will incur a ban.

#### **International duty**

- Ten Chelsea players were on senior duty during the international break: Ryan Bertrand, Gary Cahill, Daniel Sturridge (England), Luiz, Oscar, Ramires (Brazil), Eden Hazard (Belgium), Juan Mata (Spain), Ivanović (Serbia) and Conor Clifford (Republic of Ireland).

#### **Miscellaneous**

- Chelsea lost 2-1 at Roberto Di Matteo's former side West Bromwich Albion FC on Saturday, leaving the Blues four league games without a win.
- John Terry marked his return from a four-game domestic ban on 11 November with the opening goal in a 1-1 draw with Liverpool FC, but suffered a knee injury before half-time and will not play in Turin.
- Chelsea will travel to Leeds United AFC in the English League Cup quarter-finals on 19 December.
- Before last month's losses to Manchester United FC and FC Shakhtar Donetsk, Chelsea had not suffered back-to-back defeats since November 2011.
- Di Matteo is in the running to be named FIFA Coach of the Year, the winner of which will be announced on 7 January. Didier Drogba, scorer of the decisive penalty in last season's final, is nominated for the FIFA Ballon d'Or.
- Frank Lampard has not featured since aggravating a calf strain on matchday three.

- Turkey's Cüneyt Çakır has enjoyed a rapid rise since his UEFA debut as the fourth official in the UEFA Champions League first qualifying round game between Skonto FC and Sliema Wanderers FC in July 2003.
- Took charge of two matches at the 2007 UEFA European Under-19 Championship in Austria and was also the referee for two UEFA EURO 2008 qualifying fixtures. Çakır, who lives in Istanbul and works in insurance, made his refereeing debut in the UEFA Cup proper in 2008/09, taking charge of two games.
- Has been in the middle for more than 100 matches in the Turkish Süper Lig and the 2012 Super Cup. Selected for the U21 finals in Sweden in 2009, taking charge of three games including England's penalty shoot-out win against the hosts in the semi-finals.
- Oversaw Fulham's second-leg win against Hamburger SV in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League semi-finals, one of seven matches he refereed in total in the competition that season. Çakır made his UEFA Champions League group stage bow in December 2010 and was selected for the 2011 FIFA U-20 World Cup, when he was in the middle for the France-Portugal semi-final.
- Now a UEFA Champions League regular, his 2011/12 European season culminated with the FC Barcelona-Chelsea FC semi-final second leg. Having already overseen three UEFA EURO 2012 qualifiers Çakır was in the middle for three more matches in Poland and Ukraine, including Spain-Portugal in the last four, and was fourth official at the final.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Holders Chelsea FC are hoping to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight last season.
- Before this season Barcelona had finished as group winners on 13 occasions, one more than Manchester United and Real Madrid.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
