Match background

Memories will be stirred of Chelsea's finest hour in the UEFA Champions League as they kick off their round of 16 tie against Bayern München – the team they beat to claim their first European Cup.

- Current manager Frank Lampard captained the Chelsea side that defeated Bayern on penalties in the 2012 final at the German club's own stadium in Munich although Bayern were to enjoy a measure of revenge in the UEFA Super Cup the following season.
- Both teams have reason to be wary, however. The Blues' last three UEFA Champions League campaigns have all ended in the last 16, while Bayern were knocked out by English opposition at this stage 12 months ago, going down to eventual winners Liverpool their earliest exit from the competition since 2011.
- The Munich club won all six games in this season's group stage to finish eight points ahead of another London club, Tottenham who they beat 7-2 away and 3-1 at home while Chelsea had to settle for second place in Group H behind Valencia.

Previous meetings

- In the 2012 UEFA Champions League final, Thomas Müller's 83rd-minute header had seemingly given Jupp Heynckes' Bayern victory at their Fußball Arena München home, but five minutes later Didier Drogba headed an equaliser for a Chelsea team managed by Roberto Di Matteo. Former Blues winger Arjen Robben had an extra-time penalty saved by Petr Čech and there was more spot-kick misery for Bayern in the shoot-out, despite Juan Mata's miss. Čech saved from Ivica Olić and Bastian Schweinsteiger, leaving Drogba to convert the decisive kick and give Chelsea a 4-3 penalty triumph. Lampard scored Chelsea's third kick with Manuel Neuer converting from the spot for Bayern, for whom Jérôme Boateng played 120 minutes.
- Bayern were victorious in the 2013 UEFA Super Cup between the teams, at the Eden Arena in Prague. A Bayern side then coached by Josep Guardiola twice came from behind, Franck Ribéry (47) and Javi Martínez (120+1) cancelling out goals from Fernando Torres (8) and Eden Hazard (93) to force another penalty shoot-out against José Mourinho's Chelsea. Bayern ran out 5-4 winners on spot kicks with Chelsea's Romelu Lukaku having the tenth penalty of the shoot-out saved by Neuer. David Alaba scored Bayern's first kick; Lampard again converted Chelsea's third.
- Bayern and Chelsea first met in the 2004/05 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, Mourinho's Blues prevailing 6-5 on aggregate against Felix Magath's Bayern. Chelsea won the first leg 4-2 at home, Lampard scoring twice with Drogba also on target. Lampard and Drogba struck again in the second leg as Bayern won 3-2 on the night but went out on aggregate.

Form guide

Chelsea

- Chelsea kicked off this season's group stage with a 1-0 defeat at home against Valencia, Lampard's side responding with successive away victories, beating LOSC Lille 2-1 and Ajax 1-0. Their next two games finished all square, Chelsea coming back from 4-1 down to draw 4-4 with nine-man Ajax before the game at Valencia on Matchday 5 ended 2-2, but they made sure of a knockout place with a 2-1 win at home to LOSC. They finished level with Valencia on 11 points but behind the Spanish side on head-to-head record.
- The loss to Valencia on Matchday 1 is Chelsea's only European reverse at Stamford Bridge in 14 matches (W8 D5), although they had not won in three home European matches (D2 L1) before beating LOSC.
- Third in last season's Premier League, Chelsea also qualified for the 2019/20 UEFA Champions League as the winners of the UEFA Europa League, and are taking part for the 16th time; this is their 14th appearance in the round of 16.
- The London club's record in the round of 16 is W8 L5. They have lost their last three contests at this stage, most recently going down 4-1 on aggregate to Barcelona (1-1 h, 0-3 a) in 2017/18.
- This is only the fourth time Chelsea have been at home in the first leg of their round of 16 tie; their record in the previous three is W1 D1 L1, with the aggregate record W1 L2 in those ties.
- The Blues were UEFA Europa League winners under Maurizio Sarri in 2018/19, beating Arsenal 4-1 in an all-English final in Baku as Chelsea claimed their second UEFA Europa League title having also triumphed in 2013, their only other appearance in the competition.
- Chelsea beat Eintracht Frankfurt in last season's UEFA Europa League semi-finals, going through on penalties after two 1-1 draws. That extended their perfect record in two-legged knockout contests against German clubs to three wins from as many ties.
- The Blues have never lost at home to German visitors, winning six of the nine fixtures, all bar the Eintracht game in the UEFA Champions League.

• Chelsea were unbeaten in European competition last season, claiming the UEFA Europa League with a record of W12 D3 F36 A10. Before losing to Valencia on Matchday 1, their last continental defeat had come at Barcelona in the UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg in March 2018 (0-3), although they did lose on penalties against Liverpool in the UEFA Super Cup last August following a 2-2 draw after 120 minutes in Istanbul.

Bayern

- This season Bayern became only the seventh team and first from Germany to win all six games in the UEFA Champions League group stage, opening their campaign with a 3-0 win at home to Crvena zvezda before a 7-2 win at Tottenham. Olympiacos were then beaten away (3-2) and home (2-0), the latter result securing their place in the round of 16 with two games to spare, before a 6-0 victory at Crvena zvezda on Matchday 5 guaranteed first place in the section. Bayern rounded off a perfect group campaign with a 3-1 home win against Spurs in Munich.
- Robert Lewandowski scored in Bayern's first five group games and is the top scorer in this season's UEFA Champions League with ten goals, including four in the win at Crvena zvezda on Matchday 5 at 16 minutes the fastest quadruple in UEFA Champions League history. That was the 20th time Bayern had scored five or more goals in a UEFA Champions League match, setting a new competition record.
- Bayern's round of 16 record is W11 L4. They had won seven ties in a row before losing to another English club, Liverpool, last season (0-0 a, 1-3 h). It was their earliest exit from the competition since an away-goals defeat at the hands of Internazionale in 2010/11. They have reached the knockout phase in each of the past 12 seasons.
- Bayern are unbeaten in their last 12 European away games (W9 D3), scoring at least two goals in all but a goalless draw at Liverpool in last season's round of 16 first leg. Before winning at Benfica on Matchday 1 last season the Munich club had not kept a clean sheet on their UEFA Champions League travels in 14 matches; they have now managed four in the last seven.
- Bayern were the only side to collect maximum points in this season's group stage, and finished as top scorers with 24 goals one short of Paris Saint-Germain's competition record, set in 2017/18.
- This is Bayern's 23rd UEFA Champions League campaign, fewer only than Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 24). They have now won their section 16 times.
- Champions of Germany for a record 29th time last season with a landmark seventh successive Bundesliga title Bayern had reached the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals or better in seven successive campaigns before losing to Liverpool last season.
- Bayern's record in two-legged ties against English clubs is W10 L6; they had won five in a row before last season, their first defeat since losing to Chelsea in the 2004/05 quarter-finals.
- Bayern have won only two of their last six games away to English clubs (D2 L2), both victories coming in London this season's seven-goal flourish at Tottenham and a 5-1 success at Arsenal in the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg.

- César Azpilicueta's next appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, will be his 50th.
- Chelsea have won only six of their 13 matches in all competitions since Matchday 6 (D3 L4), although they were 2-1 victors at home to Tottenham on Saturday.
- That ended a run of four Premier League games without a win for Frank Lampard's side (D2 L2); they have still won only five of their last 15 (D3 L7).
- Olivier Giroud opened the scoring on Saturday, his first Premier League goal since 3 April 2019.
- The Blues have kept only seven clean sheets in their 38 matches in all competitions this season.
- Chelsea have lost seven home games in all competitions this season, their most in a campaign since suffering the same number at Stamford Bridge in 1994/95.
- Chelsea have reached the last 16 of the FA Cup thanks to wins against Championship clubs Nottingham Forest (2-0 h) and Hull (2-1 a); they will be at home to Premier League leaders Liverpool in the fifth round on 3 March.
- Andreas Christensten played 90 minutes against Tottenham despite suffering a broken nose in the 2-0 home defeat by Manchester United on 17 February.
- Ruben Loftus-Cheek has been out since 16 May with an Achilles tendon problem although he was an unused substitute on Saturday.
- Tammy Abraham returned as a second-half substitute against Tottenham having not played since 1 February due to an ankle injury.
- Christian Pulišić made his last appearance on 1 January and has been suffering with a groin injury.
- Callum Hudson-Odoi missed the defeat by Manchester United and the win against Tottenham having suffered a hamstring problem in training.
- N'Golo Kanté had to be replaced early on against United after picking up an adductor injury and missed the Tottenham game.
- Reece James signed a new Chelsea contract on 16 January, keeping him at the club until 2025. Fikayo Tomori agreed a contract extension until 2024 in December.
- On 13 February, Chelsea confirmed the signing of Ajax winger Hakim Ziyech; the Moroccan international will move to Stamford Bridge in the summer.

- Bayern have won nine of ten competitive games since Matchday 6, drawing the other. They were 3-2 victors at home to Paderborn on Friday night.
- The goalless draw at home against Leipzig on 9 February was only the second time this season Bayern have failed to score, and the first since a 2-0 defeat in the German Super Cup at Borussia Dortmund on 3 August. They had found the net in 29 successive matches between those two games.
- Bayern have scored at least three times in six of their seven matches in 2020, the exception that Leipzig stalemate.
- On 5 February Bayern won 4-3 at home to Hoffenheim in the last 16 of the German Cup. They will visit Schalke in the quarter-finals on 3 March.
- Robert Lewandowski has 25 goals in 23 games in this season's Bundesliga, including two against Paderborn on Friday. He has scored 227 league goals for Dortmund and Bayern combined, the third highest Bundesliga total of all

time.

- The Polish striker has registered 38 goals in 32 competitive Bayern games this season.
- Substitute Thomas Müller made his 517th Bayern appearance in all competitions on Friday, rising to joint seventh in the all-time list alongside Philipp Lahm.
- Joshua Zirkzee scored twice for Bayern in December in only nine minutes of playing time, in wins against Freiburg (3-1) and Wolfsburg (2-0). Those were the 18-year-old's first two Bundesliga appearances; he also came on as an 87th-minute replacement against Paderborn.
- Bayern scored three times in the first 12 minutes in the 4-1 win away to Köln on 16 February, their earliest 3-0 lead since a 5-3 win against Oberhausen in January 1973.
- Serge Gnabry scored one and set up two goals against Paderborn, the first time in his career he had provided two assists in the same game.
- Müller provided two assists at Köln, making him the first player since 2004/05 to have set up 14 goals in the first 22 Bundesliga matchdays.
- Kingsley Coman, who suffered a knee injury against Tottenham on 11 December, returned as a substitute against Leipzig and scored against Köln.
- Lucas Hernández, who had not played since surgery on an ankle injury suffered at Olympiacos on 22 October, also made his return as a replacement against Leipzig.
- Ivan Perišić broke his right ankle on 4 February and underwent surgery the same day.
- Javi Martínez is yet to play in 2020 because of a thigh injury he suffered on 21 December against Wolfsburg, but is back in individual training.
- Niklas Süle tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee on 19 October in a 2-2 draw in Augsburg and underwent surgery the following day. The defender returned to light training on 17 February.
- On 4 January Bayern announced that Schalke goalkeeper Alexander Nübel will move to Munich in the summer.

- The son of former West Ham left-back Frank Lampard Sr, he started his career with the Hammers as an apprentice and had a short spell on loan at Swansea before making his debut for the east London outfit. Moved across London to join Chelsea in 2001.
- A key figure in Chelsea's back-to-back title wins in 2004/05 and 2005/06, he equalised in the 2008 UEFA Champions League final defeat against Manchester United and scored the winner in the 2009 FA Cup decider versus Everton.
- Played a key role in Chelsea's remarkable 2012 UEFA Champions League success by converting penalties in successive rounds against Napoli and Benfica and another in the final shoot-out win against Bayern München. Surpassed Bobby Tambling's club record of 202 goals with a second-half double against Aston Villa in May 2013 and captained Chelsea to UEFA Europa League glory at the expense of Benfica in Amsterdam four days later.
- First capped by England in 1999, he scored three times at UEFA EURO 2004, his first major tournament; also featured at the FIFA World Cup in 2006 and 2010, plus UEFA EURO 2012, before retiring from international football after the 2014 World Cup having scored 29 goals in 106 England appearances, including a record nine penalties.
- Ended a 13-year playing association with Chelsea in 2014, going on to spend a year with both Manchester City and New York City before announcing his retirement in February 2017. Appointed Derby manager in May 2018, he took the club to the Championship play-off final in his sole season in charge; returned to Stamford Bridge as manager in July 2019 to succeed Maurizio Sarri, his Chelsea side losing on penalties to Liverpool in the UEFA Super Cup in Lampard's second match in charge.

Hans-Dieter Flick

Date of birth: 24 February 1965

Nationality: German

Playing career: Sandhausen, Bayern, Köln

Coaching career: Bammental, Hoffenheim, Salzburg (assistant), Germany (assistant), Bayern (assistant, caretaker)

- As a player, Flick's outstanding performances in the lower leagues earned him a Bayern contract at the age of 20. An industrious midfielder who was more valued as a team player rather than a goalscorer, he went on to make over 100 appearances in Munich before departing for Köln, where a series of injuries forced him to retire aged just 28.
- Flick's first coaching assignment led him to Hoffenheim when they were still in the fourth division, leading them to promotion in 2000/01. He then had a short spell as Giovanni Trapattoni's assistant at Salzburg, until Joachim Löw asked him to be his right-hand man for Germany's national team in summer 2006.
- His work for Die Mannschaft went well beyond the pitch, as Flick invested a considerable amount of time in setting up databases and technical information about players and their training development. This initiative led to a switch to the role of sporting director following the FIFA World Cup victory in 2014.
- Departed that role in January 2017, returning to Hoffenheim as CEO, but only stayed for a few months.
- At the beginning of 2019/20, Flick joined Niko Kovač's coaching team back at Bayern and, following the Croatian's departure on 3 November, took charge of the team on an interim basis.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

Knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 24 times, including 23 in succession. They have also played a competition-high 97 knockout phase matches ahead of Bayern München (92) and Barcelona (91).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 48 times, including six in 2018/19 a competition record for a single season.
- Before last season, only twice Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. However, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16 before Tottenham (against Ajax) did likewise in the semi-finals.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in the 2017/18 quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success, while in the 2018/19 semi-finals Liverpool lost 3-0 in the first leg at Barcelona but went through after a 4-0 home victory.
- Thirty-three ties have been decided on away goals, including 13 where the triumphant team lost the first leg. Bayern and Monaco have benefited from the away goals rule five times more than any other club whereas Internazionale have been eliminated by that method a record four times.
- In all, 29 ties have required extra time. Thirteen have been settled by extra time alone: six round of 16 encounters including Porto-Roma in 2018/19, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético Madrid.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético Madrid have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.
- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2019/20, England has also provided four clubs on eight other occasions as has Spain five times and Germany twice. England is the only nation

to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.

- There are four clubs from two nations in the round of 16 for only the third time in 2019/20. England and Spain both had four apiece in 2008/09, and there were four each from England and Germany in 2013/14.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinédine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Thirteen more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, including two Bayern players, Serge Gnabry and Robert Lewandowski, in this season's group fixtures at Tottenham Hotspur and Crvena zvezda respectively.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15 and Ronaldo himself equalled in 2017/18. Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, as did Lewandowski this season; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and voungest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucuresti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
