## Match background

---

The winners of the last two editions of the UEFA Europa League meet in the first round of Group E games in the 2020/21 UEFA Champions League as Chelsea take on Sevilla at Stamford Bridge.

- Chelsea, who lifted the UEFA Europa League for the second time in Baku in 2019, were succeeded as holders by Sevilla, whose own triumph in Cologne last season was the sixth time they had claimed that trophy, all in the last 14 years.
- This is the first meeting between the clubs, although both have plenty of recent experience against teams from their opponents' country.

### Form guide

#### Chelsea

- Fourth in the Premier League in 2019/20, this is Chelsea's 17th venture into the UEFA Champions League group stage and a third in four years. The exception came in that 2018/19 campaign, when they won the UEFA Europa League under Maurizio Sarri.
- Chelsea's last four UEFA Champions League campaigns have all ended in the round of 16. In 2019/20 they were heavily beaten home (0-3) and away (1-4) by eventual champions Bayern München at that stage. The loss in Munich ended the London club's ten-match unbeaten run away in Europe (W7 D3).
- Frank Lampard's side recovered from a Matchday 1 defeat at home to Spanish opponents last season, going down 1-0 to Valencia, to progress as Group H runners-up with 11 points, finishing behind Valencia on head-to-head record.
- The Blues have won only one of their last five UEFA Champions League matches (D2 L2).
- European champions in 2012 having been runners-up four years earlier, Chelsea have reached the round of 16 on 14 occasions.
- The London side have won their UEFA Champions League group 11 times, although they have been runners-up in their section on each of their last two participations.
- Last season's home loss to Valencia was only the Blues' fourth defeat in their last 24 matches against Spanish opponents, home and away (W7 D13); most recently, they drew 2-2 at Valencia last season.
- However, a 2-1 victory at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 2 in 2017/18 is Chelsea's only success in their last ten fixtures against Liga clubs, home and away (D5 L4).

#### Sevilla

- This is Sevilla's sixth UEFA Champions League group stage campaign, and a first since 2017/18, when they reached the quarter-finals. They have qualified for the knockout round in all but one of the previous five participations.
- Julen Lopetegui's side won the UEFA Europa League in 2019/20, beating Internazionale 3-2 in the final. It was their record-extending sixth triumph in the UEFA Cup/UEFA Europa League, all since 2006.
- Sevilla finished first in their UEFA Europa League group last season with 15 points having won all but one of their matches, then ousted CFR Cluj on away goals in the round of 32 (1-1 a, 0-0 h) before wins in one-off ties in Germany against Roma (2-0), Wolves (1-0), Manchester United (2-1) and Inter.
- Fourth in Spain in 2019/20, Sevilla won their section in each of their first two UEFA Champions League campaigns and, after finishing third in 2015/16 – when they went on to complete a hat-trick of UEFA Europa League wins – they have been group runners-up in their two most recent seasons in the competition.
- Sevilla have already played one European match this season, losing 2-1 after extra time to European champions Bayern München in the UEFA Super Cup in Budapest. It was their fifth defeat in the match in six appearances.
- The defeat by Bayern was just Sevilla's fifth loss in their last 30 European matches (W21 D4).
- Sevilla have won 16 of their 30 matches in the UEFA Champions League group stage, losing eight.
- Last season's wins against Wolves and Manchester United made it three successive victories against Premier League opponents for Sevilla, who have lost only one of their last nine games against English clubs (W5 D3).
- Sevilla have fared less well against English opposition in the UEFA Champions League group stage, however, winning one of their six matches (D2 L3).

- Hakim Ziyech's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Chelsea have won three of their seven fixtures in all competitions this season, losing only one – 2-0 at home to champions Liverpool in the Premier League on 20 September. They conceded a late equaliser to draw 3-3 at home to Southampton in the Premier League on Saturday.
- Werner (2) and Havertz both scored their first Premier League goals for Chelsea at the weekend.
- The Blues have scored 13 goals in their five Premier League matches in 2020/21 so far, and have managed three or more in seven of their last 11 league fixtures.
- Frank Lampard's side lost 5-4 on penalties to Tottenham in the last 16 of the English League Cup after a 1-1 draw on 29 September.
- Mason Mount's deflected shot gave England a 2-1 victory at home to Belgium in the UEFA Nations League on 11 October.
- Werner and Havertz both found the net in Germany's 3-3 draw at home to Switzerland in the UEFA Nations League on 13 October.
- Reece James made his first start for England on 14 October, a 1-0 loss at home to Denmark in the UEFA Nations League; he was shown a red card after the final whistle.
- Olivier Giroud won his 100th cap for France in a 7-1 friendly win at home to Ukraine on 7 October. He marked the occasion with two goals, taking his all-time tally for Les Bleus to 42, one more than Michel Platini and nine behind France's record scorer Thierry Henry.
- Ziyech, who made his delayed Chelsea debut as a second-half substitute against Southampton on Saturday after suffering a knee injury over the summer, had returned to action on 9 October as a second-half substitute in Morocco's 3-1 friendly victory against Senegal.
- Christian Pulišić came on as a late substitute in the 4-0 home win against Crystal Palace on 3 October, his first appearance since suffering a hamstring injury in the FA Cup final defeat by Arsenal on 1 August.
- Billy Gilmour has been sidelined by a knee injury since 9 July.
- Edouard Mendy returned to Chelsea on 9 October having injured his right thigh in training with Senegal two days earlier and missed the weekend game.

- Julen Lopetegui's side were undefeated in their opening three Liga games (W2 D1) before losing 1-0 at Granada on Saturday.
- The weekend result ended Sevilla's 18-match unbeaten Liga run (W10 D8), and was their first defeat since a 2-1 loss at Celta Vigo on 9 February.
- Youssef En-Nesyri scored in Morocco's 3-1 friendly victory over Senegal on 9 October, with club-mate Yassine Bounou also in action.
- Escudero was substituted 18 minutes into the loss at Granada with a hip injury.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

#### Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

#### Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, five more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16) and Barcelona (2017/18) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Anderlecht hold the unwanted record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 12 in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), in 2002/03 Lokomotiv Moskva (first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (second group stage), Rangers and Werder Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).
- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia

Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

### Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Thirteen more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Josip Iličić for Atalanta in the 2019/20 round of 16 second leg against Valencia. He was the third player to score four in a game that season, all away from home, after group stage quadruples from Bayern's Serge Gnabry (Matchday 2 at Tottenham) and Robert Lewandowski (Matchday 5 at Crvena zvezda).
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

### Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
