Match background

Chelsea kick off their defence of the UEFA Champions League with a first ever game against Zenit.

• This opening fixture in Group H – which also includes Juventus and Malmö – brings together two clubs who have been group stage regulars in recent years, albeit with contrasting results. While Chelsea's last six UEFA Champions League campaigns have extended into the round of 16 or beyond, Zenit are aiming to survive the group stage for the first time since 2015/16.

Form guide

Chelsea

- Chelsea claimed their second UEFA Champions League title in 2020/21 by beating Manchester City 1-0 in the all-English final at Porto's Estádio do Dragão on 29 May, Kai Havertz scoring the only goal in the first half – his first strike in the competition.
- The Blues had made smooth progress through their section (W4 D2) to finish ahead of Sevilla, Krasnodar and Rennes.
- With Thomas Tuchel having replaced Frank Lampard as head coach in January, Chelsea then eased past Atlético de Madrid in the round of 16, winning 1-0 in Bucharest before a 2-0 home victory, and held off Porto in the last eight (2-0 a, 0-1 h) with both matches played in Seville. Chelsea then got the better of Real Madrid in the semi-finals (1-1 a, 2-0 h) before claiming their second UEFA Champions League title against City.
- · Last season Chelsea therefore won nine of their 13 UEFA Champions League matches (D3 L1).
- Edouard Mendy kept nine clean sheets in 12 UEFA Champions League matches last season, the most in a campaign by a goalkeeper for an English side in the competition's history.
- Fourth in the Premier League in 2020/21 for the second campaign in a row, Chelsea are embarking on their 18th UEFA Champions League campaign, and a fourth in five years. The exception came in 2018/19, when they won the UEFA Europa League under Maurizio Sarri.
- Tuchel's team have already claimed European silverware this season, beating Villarreal 6-5 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the UEFA Super Cup in Belfast on 11 August. It was their first victory in the competition since 1998; they had lost the match in 2012, 2013 and 2019.
- Chelsea have been paired with a Russian club in the group stage for the second season running; in 2020/21 they took four points off debutants Krasnodar (4-0 a, 1-1 h). The latter result was their eighth game against a Russian side and only the second they had failed to win; they lost 3-2 at Rubin in the 2012/13 UEFA Europa League quarter-final second leg, but still went through 5-4 on aggregate.

Zenit

- This is the St Petersburg outfit's ninth UEFA Champions League group campaign and a third in succession; they reached the round of 16 in 2011/12, 2013/14 and 2015/16 but have never progressed further.
- Zenit have finished fourth in their section in each of the last two seasons; 2019/20 was their earliest European exit since 2009/10, when they were eliminated in the UEFA Europa League play-offs.
- In 2020/21, Zenit picked up only one point from their six games, losing both games against Club Brugge (1-2 h, 0-3 a) and Borussia Dortmund (0-2 a, 1-2 h) and aganst Lazio in Rome (1-3); their sole point came from a 1-1 home draw against the Italian club on Matchday 3.
- That was therefore the second season in a row that Zenit did not play European football during the spring, having done so in each of the previous nine.
- The St Petersburg team have won only three of their last 17 European matches (D2 L12).
- Zenit have also recorded only two victories in their last 15 UEFA Champions League games (D2 L11).
- Zenit claimed their eighth USSR/Russian league title in 2020/21, and their third in a row; their last seven triumphs have all come from 2007 onwards.
- Zenit have not played an English club since beating Liverpool on away goals in the 2012/13 UEFA Europa League round of 32 (2-0 h, 1-3 a). They have lost three of their four games in England, winning only the first, 3-0 at Bradford City in the 2000 UEFA Intertoto Cup semi-final second leg (4-0 agg).
- The Russian team also beat Manchester United 2-1 in the 2008 UEFA Super Cup in Monaco. They had defeated Rangers 2-0 in the previous season's UEFA Cup final in Manchester.

Links and trivia

• Thiago Silva had a short spell at Dinamo Moskva in 2005 but did to make a first-team appearance.

- Dejan Lovren played in England for Southampton (2013/14) and Liverpool (2014–20). His record against Chelsea was W2 D3 L5; his goal helped Liverpool to one of those victories, a 2-1 Premier League success at Stamford Bridge on 16 September 2016.
- Timo Werner helped Leipzig win home (2-1) and away (2-0) against Zenit in the 2019/20 UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Yaroslav Rakits'kyy twice faced Chelsea in the UEFA Champions League group stage while playing for Shakhtar Donetsk in 2012/13. Shakhtar won 2-1 at home before going down 3-2 in London.
- Mateo Kovačić came on as a substitute for Croatia in a 2-2 draw against Russia in the 2018 FIFA World Cup quarter-finals and missed in the penalty shoot-out, but his side still went through. Aleksandr Erokhin, Daler Kuzyaev and Artem Dzyuba featured for the hosts.
- N'Golo Kanté opened the scoring when France beat Russia 4-2 in a friendly in March 2016, his first international goal. Dzyuba featured for the visitors.
- Andreas Christensen and Dzyuba were both on target in Denmark's 4-1 victory against Russia in the UEFA EURO 2020 group stage. Vyacheslav Karavaev, Magomed Ozdoev and Kuzyaev also played for Russia.
- Romelu Lukaku has scored five goals against Russia, most recently on Matchday 1 of UEFA EURO 2020 group stage when his double led Belgium to a 3-0 win in St Petersburg. Karavaev, Ozdoev, Kuzyaev and Dzyuba featured for Russia.

- Chelsea are still unbeaten in this season's Premier League (W3 D1), scoring nine goals and conceding only one, a penalty. They were 3-0 winners at home to Aston Villa on Saturday.
- That was Chelsea's 600th Premier League win; only Manchester United (690) have more.
- Thomas Tuchel's side beat Crystal Palace 3-0 in their opening fixture before a 2-0 victory at London rivals Arsenal in which Romelu Lukaku scored his first goal for the club. The Belgian added two more against Villa at the weekend.
- The Blues held out for a 1-1 draw at Liverpool on 28 August despite playing the whole second half with ten men following Reece James' red card.
- · Chelsea's nine league goals this season have been scored by seven different players.
- On 5 September Lukaku marked his 100th cap for Belgium with his 67th international goal in a 3-0 win at home to the Czech Republic in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying. He had scored twice in a 5-2 victory in Estonia three days earlier.
- Timo Werner scored in Germany's 2-0 win away to Liechtenstein on 2 September and also registered a goal and an assist as Germany beat Armenia 6-0 on 5 September.
- Werner scored again, from a Kai Havertz assist, with Antonio Rüdiger also on target in Germany's 4-0 win in Iceland on 8 September. Jorginho captained Italy to a 5-0 home win against Lithuania the same evening.
- Jorginho started all seven games as Italy triumphed at UEFA EURO 2020, scoring the winning penalty in the semifinal shoot-out against Spain.
- Mason Mount made five appearances for EURO runners-up England, while James played once and Ben Chilwell was an unused squad member.
- N'Golo Kanté was forced off at half-time at Liverpool with an ankle injury and has not played since.

- Lukaku suffered a thigh injury against the Czech Republic and was replaced late on, but played 90 minutes on Saturday.
- Christian Pulišić is expected to be sidelined for ten days with an ankle injury picked up on international duty.
- On 26 August, Jorginho was named UEFA Men's Player of the Year. Edouard Mendy was named Goalkeeper of the Season while Kanté collected the award for the best midfielder and Thomas Tuchel won the coach's prize.

- Zenit claimed the Russian Super Cup on 17 July, beating Lokomotiv Moskva 3-0 thanks to goals from Daler Kuzyaev, Serdar Azmoun and Aleksandr Erokhin. It was the sixth time they had won the trophy one short of CSKA Moskva's record and a second in succession.
- Zenit are still unbeaten seven matches into the new Russian Premier League season (W5 D2). They were 3-1 winners at home to Akhmat Grozny on Saturday.
- Azmoun and Aleksandr Erokhin, who found the net at the weekend, have both scored five league goals this season, fewer only than Lokomotiv's Fedor Smolov, who has six.
- Azmoun's winner in a 1-0 home victory against CSKA Moskva on 26 August was his 100th goal for a Russian club: Rubin (17), Rostov (25) and Zenit (58).
- Erokhin scored a spectacular goal in Russia's 2-0 win in Cyprus in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 4 September. Vyacheslav Karavaev and Daler Kuzyaev also featured in all three of Russia's recent World Cup qualifiers.
- Aleksei Sutormin was called up by Russia for the first time for the September internationals, but is still awaiting his debut.
- Magomed Ozdoev injured knee ligaments eight minutes into Zenit's opening league fixture, a 3-1 win at Khimki on 24 July, and has not played since.
- Douglas Santos has signed a two-year contract extension with Zenit, keeping him at the club until 2026.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, four more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16), Barcelona (2017/18) and Manchester City (2020/21) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Marseille hold the record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 13 in a row between March 2012 and November 2020. The 2-0 loss at home to Porto on Matchday 4 of the 2020/21 competition surpassed Anderlecht's previous competition record of 12 losses in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), Lokomotiv Moskva (2002/03, first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (2002/03, second group stage), Rangers and Werder

Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).

• Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fourteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Olivier Giroud for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage. That was the fourth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
