Match background

Real Madrid are well placed to avenge last season's UEFA Champions League elimination at the hands of Chelsea as the teams reconvene at the Santiago Bernabéu with Karim Benzema's first-leg hat-trick having put the Spanish side in charge of the quarter-final tie against the holders.

- Benzema scored three goals for the second successive UEFA Champions League match with his haul at Stamford Bridge, the French international heading in twice in the space of four first-half minutes (21, 24) and then restoring Madrid's two-goal cushion a minute into the second period after Kai Havertz (40) had halved Chelsea's deficit.
- Chelsea overcame Madrid 3-1 over the two-legged semi-finals in 2020/21 but the first-leg loss this season ended their unbeaten record against the Spanish club, who have not lost a tie at this stage of the UEFA Champions League since 2003/04.
- Both teams beat French opponents in this season's round of 16, Benzema's hat-trick inspiring Madrid to a comeback victory against Paris Saint-Germain while Chelsea eased past LOSC Lille.
- This is one of two 2021/22 quarter-finals between former European Cup winners, Benfica's tie against Liverpool the other.
- The winners of this tie will play Manchester City or Atlético de Madrid in the semi-finals.

Previous meetings

- Chelsea were 3-1 aggregate winners against Madrid in last season's semi-finals, goals from Timo Werner (28) and Mason Mount (85) securing a 2-0 second-leg victory at Stamford Bridge. The first leg in Spain had finished 1-1, Christian Puljić's 14th-minute opener for the visitors cancelled out by Benzema 15 minutes later.
- The teams had met in only three previous fixtures before last season – in two UEFA finals which were both won by Chelsea. Their previous meeting before 2021 came in the 1998 UEFA Super Cup in Monaco, when a Gustavo Poyet goal seven minutes from time at the Stade Louis II gave UEFA Cup Winners' Cup holders Chelsea a 1-0 victory against Madrid, who had qualified by winning the UEFA Champions League.
- The English club also came out on top in the 1971 European Cup Winners' Cup final against Madrid in Piraeus. The first game finished 1-1, Peter Osgood's 56th-minute goal at the Georgios Karaiskakis Stadium cancelled out in the final minute by Ignacio Zoco.
- Two days later at the same stadium, first-half goals from John Dempsey (31) and Osgood again (39) earned Chelsea their first European trophy despite Sebastián Fleitas pulling one back for Madrid 15 minutes from time.

- This is Madrid's 18th appearance in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals. They have won their last nine contests at this stage.
- Madrid won five of their six Group D games this season, the exception a stunning 2-1 defeat at home to debutants Sheriff on Matchday 2, as they finished first in their section for the third time in four seasons. Away from home they kept clean sheets in winning at Inter (1-0), Shakhtar Donetsk (5-0) and Sheriff (3-0).
- The Merengues lost 1-0 at Paris in the round of 16 first leg, however, and looked to be heading out when they fell further behind in the Santiago Bernabéu, but Benzema struck three times in the final half-hour to turn the tie on its head.
- Benzema's first-leg hat-trick was his fourth in the UEFA Champions League and only the seventh time a player has scored two or more hat-tricks in a single campaign. He is just the fourth player to have scored hat-tricks in successive UEFA Champions League matches, and one of only two to have done so in the knockout phase, Cristiano Ronaldo having previously achieved the feat, also for Madrid, in 2016/17.
- Benzema's goals at Stamford Bridge mean Madrid have now registered more UEFA Champions League hat-tricks than any other club – 14, one more than Barcelona.
- The Spanish side have won only eight of their last 16 home European games (D3 L5) although they have been victorious in seven of the most recent nine (D1 L1).
- Under Zinedine Zidane, Madrid also finished first in their section in 2020/21, picking up six of their ten points against Inter and sealing progress as group winners with a 2-0 home defeat of Borussia Mönchengladbach on Matchday 6.
- Madrid then won both legs against Atalanta in the round of 16 (1-0 a, 3-1 h) before eliminating Liverpool in the quarter-finals (3-1 h, 0-0 a) prior to losing to Chelsea.
- Zidane was replaced by former Chelsea manager Carlo Ancelotti in the summer, the Italian having guided Madrid to their tenth European Cup in 2013/14.
- The Spanish side were second in the 2020/21 Liga, finishing two points behind neighbours Atlético.
- Having reached the semi-finals or better for eight successive seasons between 2010/11 and 2017/18, Madrid lost in the last 16 against Ajax in 2018/19 and Manchester City the following season but have now reached the quarter-finals in each of the last two campaigns.
- Madrid's record in two-legged knockout ties against English clubs is W9 L6; they have won four of the last six, although their last two UEFA Champions League campaigns have been ended by Premier League opponents – Chelsea last season and Manchester City in the 2019/20 round of 16 (1-2 h, 1-2 a).
- Last season's win against Liverpool made it four victories from four ties against English opponents in UEFA Champions League quarter-finals.
- The first-leg loss to Manchester City in the 2019/20 round of 16 first leg was only Madrid's third at home to English clubs; their record otherwise is W9 D7, although they have won only one of their last four games against English visitors in Madrid (D2 L1).
- Madrid have won 34 of the 36 ties in which they recorded an away first-leg win in UEFA competition, most recently against Atalanta last season. They had lost on the previous occasion, however, against Ajax in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League round of 16 (2-1 a, 1-4 h), their first aggregate defeat when winning the away first leg since losing to Odense in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup third round (3-2 a, 0-2 h).
- This is only the third time Madrid have won the away first leg 3-1 in UEFA competition, and the first since they beat Utrecht in the 1991/92 UEFA Cup second round (1-0 h). The only previous instance in the European Cup came

against Dinamo București in the 1963/64 first round (5-3 h).

- The Blues have won their last three contests at this stage, and eight of the last nine.
- This season, Chelsea looked set to take first place in Group H heading into the final round of matches after a 4-0 win at home to Juventus in their penultimate fixture had given the English club the head-to-head advantage over their Italian rivals following a 1-0 defeat in Turin. However, a Zenit goal four minutes into added time earned a 3-3 draw that left Chelsea on 13 points, two behind Juventus.
- The loss at Juventus is one of only two in Chelsea's last 21 away European games (W14 D5).
- The London club made it four victories from four at Stamford Bridge in this season's competition with a 2-0 first-leg win against LOSC and then sealed progress with a 2-1 success in France. Chelsea had therefore not conceded a goal at home in this season's competition before their loss to Madrid.
- Chelsea claimed their second UEFA Champions League title in 2020/21 by beating Manchester City 1-0 in the all-English final at Porto's Estádio do Dragão on 29 May, Kai Havertz scoring the only goal in the first half – his first strike in the competition.
- The Blues had made smooth progress through their section (W4 D2) to finish ahead of Sevilla, Krasnodar and Rennes.
- With Thomas Tuchel having replaced Frank Lampard as head coach in January, Chelsea then eased past Atlético in the round of 16, winning 1-0 in Bucharest before a 2-0 home victory, and held off Porto in the last eight (2-0 a, 0-1 h) with both matches played in Seville. Chelsea then got the better of Madrid in the semi-finals before claiming their second UEFA Champions League title against City.
- The first-leg defeat by Madrid was only Chelsea's fifth in their last 29 UEFA Champions League matches (W18 D6).
- Edouard Mendy kept nine clean sheets in 12 UEFA Champions League matches last season, the most in a campaign by a goalkeeper for an English side in the competition's history. He has added another five from his eight appearances this term.
- Fourth in the Premier League in 2020/21 for the second season in a row, Chelsea are participating in their 18th UEFA Champions League campaign, and a fourth in five years. The exception came in 2018/19, when they won the UEFA Europa League under Maurizio Sarri.
- Chelsea had already faced Spanish opposition earlier this season, beating Villarreal 6-5 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in the UEFA Super Cup in Belfast in August. It was their first victory in the competition since beating Real Madrid in 1998; they had lost in 2012, 2013 and 2019.
- Chelsea's overall record against Spanish clubs is W19 D18 L11. Away it is W6 D9 L6.
- The defeat by Madrid is one of only five in Chelsea's last 32 matches against Spanish opponents overall (W11 D16). Before winning 4-0 at Sevilla on Matchday 5 of last season's UEFA Champions League, the Blues had been victorious in only one of their previous 11 fixtures against Liga clubs, home and away (D6 L4); they have now won four of the last seven.
- Chelsea have played 13 two-legged knockout ties against Spanish clubs (W6 L7).
- Tuchel was unbeaten as a head coach against Spanish clubs (W4 D5) before Madrid's first-leg victory.

- Last season's draw at Madrid made it one defeat in Chelsea's last 14 matches against Liga clubs in Spain (W4 D9).
- The London club have won only two of their 12 knockout games against Spanish teams in Spain (D5 L5), but have lost just one of the last seven there (W1 D5).
- Chelsea have suffered only three previous first-leg home defeats in UEFA competition, all in the UEFA Champions League, and went on to lose all three ties on aggregate – in the round of 16 against Barcelona in 2005/06 (1-2 h, 1-1 a) and Bayern München in 2019/20 (0-3 h, 1-4 a) and Manchester United in the 2010/11 quarter-finals (0-1 h, 1-2 a).

Links and trivia

- Ancelotti was in charge of Chelsea between 2009 and 2011, winning the 2009/10 Premier League and FA Cup in his first season.
- Tuchel twice took on Madrid with Paris in the 2019/20 group stage; his side won 3-0 in France before scoring twice in the final ten minutes to earn a 2-2 draw in Spain after Benzema's double.
- Tuchel and Ancelotti's only UEFA Champions League meetings before this tie came in the 2018/19 group stage, when Tuchel's Paris Saint-Germain drew twice with Ancelotti's Napoli – 2-2 in Paris and 1-1 in Naples.
- The coaches had previously met in the 2016/17 German Bundesliga, Tuchel's Borussia Dortmund defeating Ancelotti's Bayern München 1-0 at home but losing 4-1 in Munich. Tuchel, however, got the better of Ancelotti in their most recent encounter before this tie, when Chelsea defeated Everton 2-0 at Stamford Bridge in the Premier League on 8 March 2021.
- Eden Hazard was a Chelsea player between 2012 and joining Madrid in 2019, scoring 110 goals in 352 games in all competitions. He helped the club win Premier League titles in 2014/15 and 2016/17, the FA Cup in 2017/18 and the English League Cup in 2014/15, in addition to their victories in the 2013 and 2019 UEFA Europa League finals. The latter match, in which he scored twice in a 4-1 defeat of Arsenal, was his last for Chelsea.
- Thibaut Courtois made 154 appearances for Chelsea between 2014 and 2018, when he moved to Madrid. He was also part of the Premier League-winning sides in 2014/15 and 2016/17, and the team that won the FA Cup in 2017/18 and the English League Cup in 2014/15.
- Mateo Kovačić joined Chelsea from Madrid in 2018. He had signed for the Spanish side in 2015 and was an unused substitute in their UEFA Champions League final victories in 2017 and 2018 having missed out on the matchday squad for their 2016 final triumph. He did feature in their 2016 UEFA Super Cup defeat of Sevilla and was on the bench when Manchester United were beaten in the same competition a year later. Kovačić was also in Madrid's victorious squads in the 2016 and 2017 FIFA Club World Cup and the 2016/17 Spanish Liga and Super Cup.
- Born in Madrid, Marcos Alonso joined the club in 1999 and came through the youth system, making one Liga appearance in 2010 before leaving that summer.

Latest news

Real Madrid

- David Alaba made his 100th appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, in the first leg; he was the 45th player to reach a century of games in the competition.
- The first-leg win at Chelsea and Saturday's 2-0 home success against Getafe have made it eight victories in Madrid's last nine games in all competitions.
- Casemiro opened the scoring on Saturday with his first Liga goal since 1 May 2021, Lucas Vázquez securing the win with his first strike since 24 October 2021.
- The exception in that run of wins came on 20 March with a 4-0 reverse at home to Barcelona, Madrid's heaviest Clásico defeat since a 5-1 loss at the Camp Nou in 2018 and their heaviest home defeat in the fixture since another 4-0 loss in November 2015.
- Karim Benzema had scored in seven successive Madrid matches, 13 goals in all, before drawing a blank on Saturday; he has ten in his last five appearances.
- Benzema has 37 goals in 37 appearances in all competitions this season.
- Benzema's tally of 24 Liga goals so far this season means he has passed the 20-goal mark in the league for the fourth season running; he is the seventh player to achieve that feat.
- The defeat against Barcelona was Madrid's first in the Liga since a 1-0 loss at Getafe on 2 January, and just their third of the season.
- Madrid were knocked out of the Copa del Rey by a 1-0 quarter-final loss at Athletic Club on 3 February.
- The Merengues did, however, claim the Spanish Super Cup in January, beating Barcelona 3-2 after extra time in the semi-finals before securing a 2-0 victory against Athletic with goals from Luka Modrić and Benzema.
- Gareth Bale scored twice as Wales defeated Alaba's Austria 2-1 in the 2022 FIFA World Cup play-off semi-finals on 25 March. They were the Welshman's first goals since September's qualifying hat-trick against Belarus.
- Eden Hazard has not played since coming on as a late substitute in a 3-0 home victory against Alavés on 19 February. The Belgian underwent surgery to remove a metal plate in his right fibula on 29 March and is expected to be out for a month.
- Isco (back) and Luka Jović (ankle) have both missed Madrid's last three games while Ferland Mendy sat out Saturday's win with a knock.

Chelsea

- Christian Puljić made his 50th appearance in UEFA club competition in the first leg; Marcos Alonso will reach the same mark when he next features.
- Chelsea were 6-0 winners at Southampton on Saturday, scoring three times in the first 21 minutes – the earliest they had gone 3-0 up in the Premier League era – and four in the first 31. Mason Mount and Timo Werner both scored twice.
- That made it seven successive away wins in all competitions, equalling the club record set in 1989 and matched in 2019.
- The first-leg loss to Madrid had made it successive defeats for Chelsea for only the second time this season, and the first since September.
- Chelsea's 14-game unbeaten run in all competitions (W12 D2) had been ended on 2 April when they went down 4-1 at home to London rivals Brentford at Stamford Bridge, their first defeat against the Bees since 1939.
- The seven goals conceded against Brentford and Madrid were as many as in Chelsea's 14 previous matches in all competitions combined, a run that included eight clean sheets.
- One of the draws in that 14-match sequence, 0-0 against Liverpool at Wembley in the League Cup final on 27 February, preceded an 11-10 defeat on penalties.

- That draw against Liverpool in the League Cup final was the only one of Chelsea's previous 13 matches in all competitions they had failed to win before losing to Brentford.
- That Brentford defeat was Chelsea's first since a 1-0 reverse at Premier League leaders Manchester City on 15 January. The first leg against Madrid is one of just three losses in 28 games in all competitions (W18 D7).
- The Blues have kept seven clean sheets in their last 12 games.
- Chelsea reached the FA Cup semi-finals with a 2-0 win at Championship club Middlesbrough on 19 March. They will play Crystal Palace in the last four at Wembley on 17 April.
- A 2-1 extra-time win against Brazilian side Palmeiras on 12 February gave Chelsea the FIFA Club World Cup for the first time, Kai Havertz getting the decisive goal from the penalty spot in the 117th minute. Romelu Lukaku had scored Chelsea's opener having also got the only goal in the semi-final win against Al-Hilal of Saudi Arabia.
- Lukaku has scored three FA Cup goals this season but has not found the net in the Premier League since 29 December.
- Havertz got the fourth goal at Southampton on Saturday, his eighth in his last 11 Chelsea appearances.
- Werner's goals on Saturday were his first in the Premier League since 2 October, when he also scored against Southampton in a 3-1 home win. Those are his only three league goals in 2021/22.
- Pulišić scored his first hat-trick for the United States in a 5-1 FIFA World Cup qualifying win at home to Panama on 27 March.
- Jorginho's Italy missed out on a place at this year's World Cup, the European champions going down 1-0 at home to North Macedonia in their play-off semi-final on 25 March.
- On 29 March Edouard Mendy helped Senegal beat Egypt in a penalty shoot-out to book their place at the World Cup.
- Reece James was sidelined by a hamstring injury from 29 December; he returned in the League Cup final but suffered muscular problems in his other leg after a 4-0 win at Burnley on 5 March, returning as a second-half substitute against Brentford before playing 90 minutes against Madrid.
- Andreas Christensen returned in the first leg against Madrid having not played since going off in the first half of the round of 16 second leg at LOSC Lille with a muscle injury.
- Callum Hudson-Odoi, whose last appearance came on 2 March, has a calf injury.
- Ben Chilwell is expected to miss the rest of the season after suffering a ruptured cruciate ligament on 23 November.
- Lukaku sat out Saturday's win at Southampton with an achilles injury.
- On 17 January Tuchel was named Best FIFA Men's Coach for 2021, with Mendy taking the goalkeeper's award. Emma Hayes, Chelsea women's head coach, took the women's coach prize.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League : Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

UEFA Champions League knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 26 times, including 25 in succession. The first leg of their 2020/21 round of 16 tie against Atalanta was their 100th knockout match in the competition; they have now played 107 knockout games, ahead of Bayern München (102) and Barcelona (97).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 50 times, including six in 2018/19 – a competition record for a single season – and Real Madrid in the 2021/22 round of 16.
- Before 2018/19, only twice – Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. However, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16 before Tottenham (against Ajax) did likewise in the semi-finals.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in the 2017/18 quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success, while in the 2018/19 semi-finals Liverpool lost 3-0 in the first leg at Barcelona but went through after a 4-0 home victory.
- In all, 31 ties have required extra time. Fifteen have been settled by extra time alone: eight round of 16 encounters including Porto-Juventus in 2020/21, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.
- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.

- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2021/22, England has also provided four clubs on nine other occasions – as has Spain six times and Germany three. England is the only nation to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.
- There have been 220 UEFA Champions League quarter-finalists. Spain has provided the largest number (55), followed by England (50), with Germany in third place on 34 and Italy fourth on 30. Twelve other countries have provided teams for the last eight.
- In 2019/20 Barcelona reached a record 13th successive European Cup quarter-final, a run that was ended the following season.
- Bayern have reached 20 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, one more than Barça and Real Madrid.
- The biggest European Cup quarter-final victory was Real Madrid's 8-0 first-leg defeat of Sevilla in 1957/58. In 2019/20 Bayern became the second team to score eight in a last-eight match, defeating Barcelona 8-2.
- Manchester United's 7-1 win against Roma in 2006/07 is the biggest victory in a UEFA Champions League quarter-final match, a margin Bayern matched against Barcelona in 2019/20 (8-2). Bayern beat Porto 6-1 in 2014/15, Barcelona have twice won 5-1, against Chelsea after extra time (1999/2000) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2010/11), while there have been four 4-0 victories.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fifteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Sébastien Haller for Ajax at Sporting CP on Matchday 1 in 2021/22. That was the fifth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20 and Olivier Giroud did likewise for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage.
- Cristiano Ronaldo has scored 67 goals in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds, more than any other player. Messi is second on 49 goals, ahead of Lewandowski (29), Thomas Müller (26), Karim Benzema (23), Raúl González and Andriy Shevchenko (both 18).
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20 and Sébastien Haller in 2021/22; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18), Luiz Adriano (2014/15) and Lewandowski (2021/22) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter

Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
