TODAY'S fixtures are the reverse of those played on the opening day in August, and for us that was a day when Arsenal comprehensively beat us three-nil at Highbury. Then, as soon as this match is over, both clubs will be concentrating on a European date next Wednesday, when Arsenal meet the Swiss team, Grasshoppers in Zurich, while we are in Sweden to face Atvidaberg.

Next Saturday we are at home again, to Southampton, and as a result of Monday's replay victory against Nottingham Forest, we stage a fourth round League Cup-tie against Bolton Wanderers on Wednesday week (Oct. 27), a week before the European Cup-Winners' Cup home leg against

Atvidaberg.

With regard to both the Bolton and Atvidaberg matches here, would Season Ticket Holders please note that they have until Friday next (Oct. 22) to claim their seats.
