I don't like it, but it's got to be done. Now that we're in the country, I may go in for homing pigeons as a hobby. I enjoy driving and on TV I go for Westerns, thrillers and, of course, sport.

You're a young man earning big money, Marvin. Are you careful or carefree with it?

I think if I were still single I might go in for a bit of wild spending at times, but my wife is a very good influence here. With a house to be furnished you can count me in the "careful" category.

Do you smoke or drink?

I've never put on a cigarette in my life.

I'm not really a drinker, either, though I enjoy a lager and lime.

As a professional sportsman, what do you value above all else?

The feeling and the knowledge that I'm 100 per cent. fit. Good health is the greatest thing in life; it's something no money on this earth can buy.

And is there any one unforgettable lesson you have learned in football?

Yes, never give up, no matter how hopeless a situation may seem. The match that taught me this was at the Valley in December, 1957. With three minutes to go, Huddersfield made it 6-6, but in the last seconds Ryan scored the goal that gave Charlton a fantastic 7-6 win. The late Johnny Summers hit five that day, and if ever there was a case of a lost match being won, that was it. I never expect to watch another thriller quite like that.
