## The Talk of Stamford Bridge

**A**FTER eight games we are the only unbeaten club in the Championship, a distinction we are naturally eager to preserve today against Leeds United, who stand right behind us. Wednesday night's win at Hillsborough, after twice being behind, earned a "best we have played this season" rating from Manager Tommy Docherty. The victory followed good news that afternoon of Frank Blunstone, who was told by the specialist that he should be training full out again in about a month. Yes, Wednesday was a good day—and a good night!

Bobby Tambling hoped to be back in action this afternoon after his tough afternoon last Saturday. He was still in a very dazed state that evening, and although by Sunday he was feeling much more himself again, when Monday came a further day in St. Stephen's was advised.

He has since been to Brighton for a few days' recuperation.

Our best results day of the season to date. That was last Saturday, when all four

Chelsea sides were successful. In addition to our First Division win over Fulham, the Combination side beat Fulham 2-1 at Craven Cottage, and at Hendon our Youth section had two wins, 7-2 against Spurs in the morning and 3-2 against Crystal Palace in the afternoon.

On the move: Centre-forward Jimmy Mulholland left us this week to pursue his football career back home in Scotland. He has joined Morton, the club who won promotion to Scottish Division I in runaway style last season, and as part of the deal Billy Sinclair, Morton's promising 17-year-old inside-forward, has transferred to Chelsea. We wish Jimmy good luck and extend a warm welcome to Billy. He should feel thoroughly "at home" among the many Scots at Stamford Bridge.

Kick-off in our Football League Cup second round tie away to Birmingham City next Wednesday will be 7.30 p.m. In the event of a draw, the replay will be at Stamford Bridge on Monday October 5



(7.30 p.m.). That would mean four first-team home games in eight days, for we have League matches against Manchester United (September 30) and Blackburn (October 3) and the big night against Benfica on October 7.

There was a big improvement last Saturday following our programme appeal to keep off the pitch, but a number of boys nevertheless went on the field at the end of the match.

We would remind the comparative few miscreants that they are in danger of spoiling match days for all our young supporters who know how to conduct themselves.

The co-operation of all spectators would be appreciated in discouraging young spectators from going on the field.

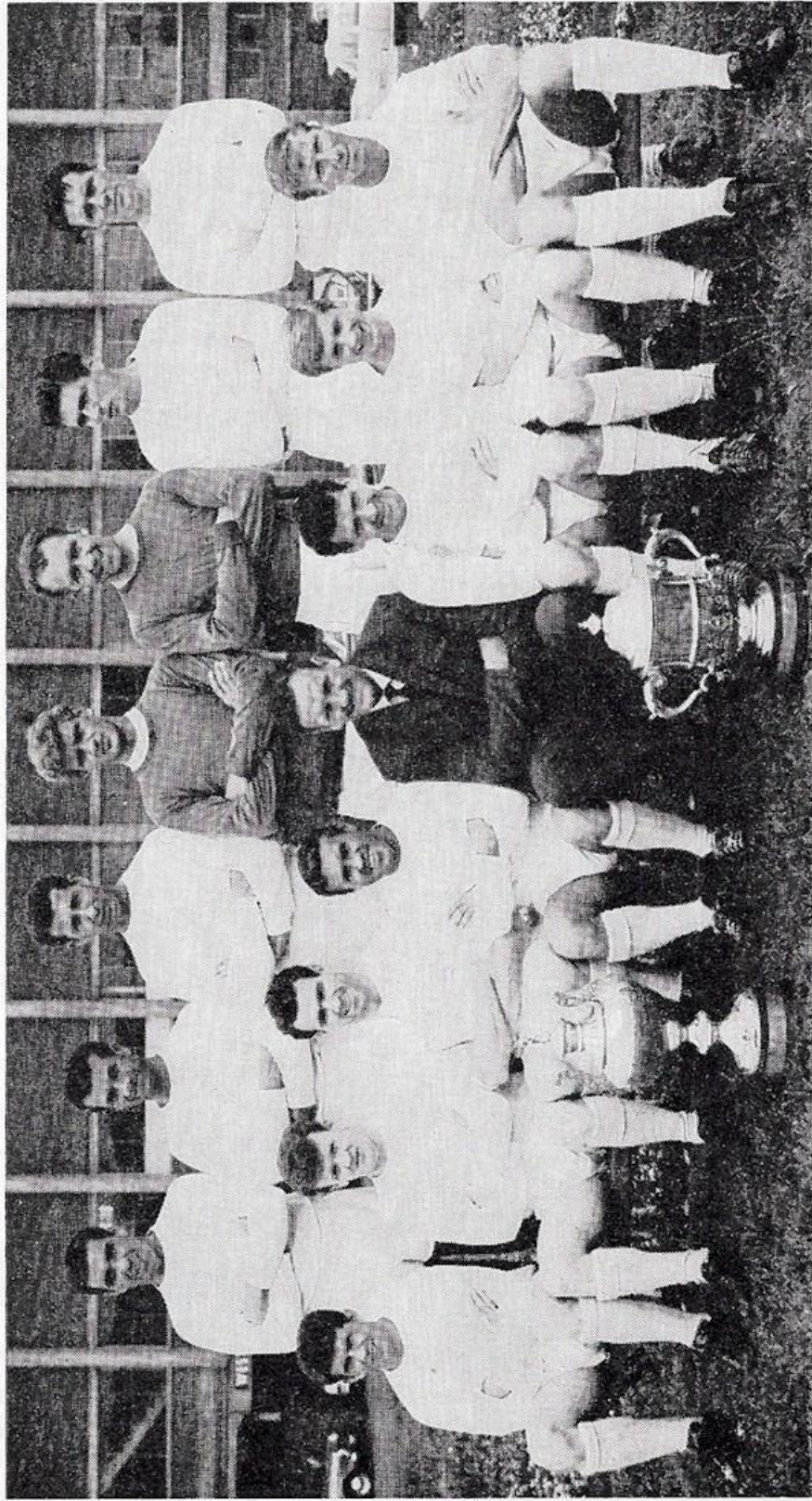

## ABOUT OUR VISITORS

**H**AVING already defeated Sunderland, one of last season's promoted sides, we now welcome Leeds United, the other promoted club. When we last met them—in the Second Division in 1962-63—they took three points from us, winning 2-0 at Elland Road and drawing 2-2 here.

Just how well they played last season is shown by the fact that they lost only three League matches, all away. They won 12 and drew nine of their home games, and also gained 12 away victories. The basis of their success was an extremely sound defence, which conceded only 34 goals.

### Flying Start

Leeds began this season most encouragingly with victory, like ourselves, in their three opening games, including one over League champions Liverpool by 4-2 at Elland Road. Last Saturday they pulled back from two down and beat Leicester City 3-2.

Goalkeeper Gareth Sprake had a dramatic introduction to the Leeds senior side two years ago, at the age of 16. He was flown to Southampton when Scottish international Tommy Younger was taken ill. Sprake has since played for Wales in both Under-23 and full internationals. He was born in the same street at Swansea as former Arsenal and Wales 'keeper Jack Kelsey.

Although a Londoner, Paul Reaney is one of Leeds' own products, joining them shortly after leaving school and becoming a professional in 1962. He was capped by England at Under-23 level last season.

A former Scottish amateur international with Queen's Park, Willie Bell joined Leeds

in the summer of 1960, playing in both wing-half positions before switching to left-back in place of long-serving Grenville Hair.

Now in his fifth season on the Elland Road staff, Billy Bremner has played for Scotland at schoolboy and Under-23 level. Born at Stirling, he used to be an inside-forward, and also played occasionally on the wing before moving into the middle line at the start of last season.

### Bobby's Brother

Brother of the Manchester United and England forward, Jack Charlton has been with Leeds for 11 years and played in over 300 League matches. He succeeded John Charles at centre-half, quickly proving a great successor to the brilliant Welshman. A native of Ashington (Northumberland), Charlton made only 25 League appearances last winter due to injuries, his lowest total in the past seven seasons.

Ever-present in the Leeds team last season was Norman Hunter, who hails from Middlesbrough and made his first senior appearance two years ago when two more experienced wing-halves were out of action. He took his chance so well he has never since been out except when injured.

An Eire international who has played for his country in three forward positions, Dublin-born John Giles, came into prominence with Manchester United, gaining a Cup winners' medal against Leicester City in 1963. Shortly after the start of last season he was transferred to Leeds at a substantial fee.

Don Weston scored a hat-trick in his first game for Leeds after joining them from Rotherham in December 1962, and has since scored consistently, if not sensationally. Although born at Mansfield, he started his career with Welsh club Wrexham in 1958, two years later moved to Birmingham City, and joined Rotherham in December 1960.

### Unlucky Peacock

With Alan Peacock, who was signed from Middlesbrough in February, out of action this season with cartilage trouble,



Jim Storrie has been leading the Leeds front line. Born at Kirkintilloch, he joined the Yorkshire club from Airdrieonians in the summer of 1962.

Diminutive former Scottish international Bobby Collins is United's skipper and the man who makes the front line "tick". A native of Glasgow, he had a long spell with Celtic before signing for Everton six years ago, being a regular member of the Merseysiders' team up to his transfer to Leeds in March 1962.

Johannesburg-born Albert Johanneson was so keen to try his luck as a professional footballer in this country, that he paid his own fare from South Africa. Leeds signed him after trials and he made his debut towards the end of the 1960-61 season. Extremely fast, with a strong and accurate shot, he scored 13 goals in 37 League outings last season.

With utility forward Ian Lawson and left-back Willie Bell both absent last week—Lawson has cartilage trouble—Leeds brought in two young players. They were Terry Cooper, who took Bell's place, and Jim Greenhoff, who played right-half, so that Bremner could move into the attack.

A native of Pontefract, Cooper is one of the club's own products. He made his League debut, at outside-left, in April. Greenhoff, who comes from Barnsley, had two senior games last winter at right-half when Bremner was absent.

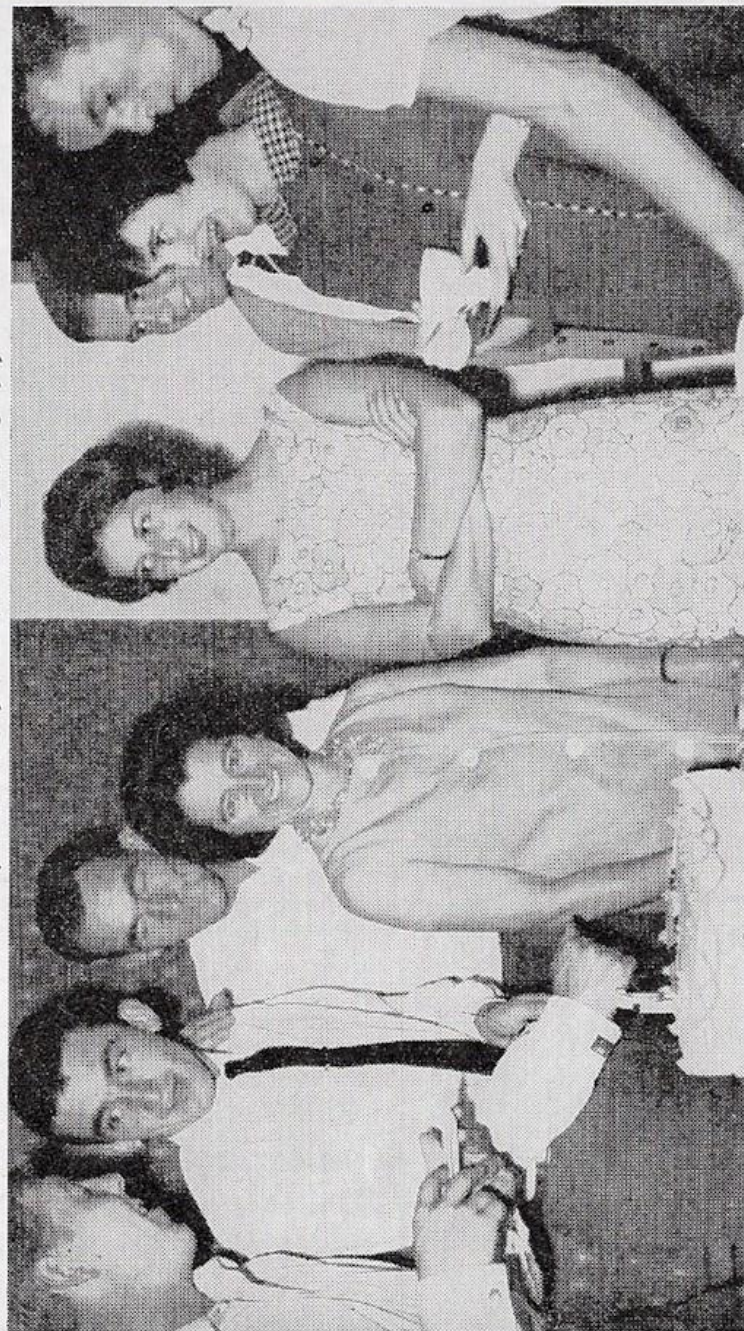
