SEAT RESERVATIONS

PRICES of reserved seats for home League matches are: £1.20 West Stand only (all £1.20 tickets in East Stand have been sold as Season Tickets); 80p East and West Stands; 60p North Stand only. Tickets are obtainable as follows:

1. FOOTBALL LEAGUE

(a) Home: You may write AT ANY TIME to the Box Office, stating number and price of seats required and enclosing correct remittance and return envelope. You may call at the Box Office at any time in office hours—9.30 a.m.-4.30 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Fridays: 9.30 a.m.-12 noon Thursday. The Box Office is open on Saturday except during the period of the match being played and on First Team match days can handle tickets for other matches only

from 9.30 a.m.-12 noon or from 5 p.m.-5.30 p.m.

(b) Away: We are negotiating with a number of clubs to supply us with an allocation of Away League match tickets. Details will be published

in the Club Programme.

2. FOOTBALL LEAGUE CUP

(a) Home: (i) Season Ticket Holders should apply, either in writing or in person, immediately prices are announced. We will hold their seats for 7 days following the Cup draw, following which any seats unclaimed will be offered for sale to the general public.

(ii) General Public: See above. An announcement will be made as soon as position is known.

(b) Away: (i) Season Ticket Holders have first call on seats available, subject to the 7-day limitation in 2(a)(i) above. Prices will be announced when known.
(ii) General Public—as in 2(a)(ii) above.

(iii) Replays: Arrangements will be announced

in Match Programmes.

3. EUROPEAN CUP-WINNERS' CUP

Normal prices will be charged for our second round, second leg tie at home to Atvidaberg (Sweden) on November 3rd and applications for seats may now be made in person or by post.
